The paper tested students' logical reasoning, analytical thinking, and problem-solving skills. Overall, the examination process was well-organized and completed successfully. SCIENCE CLASS ACTIVITY- CLASS IX

The introductory Science lessons for Class IX focused on the chapter "Matter in Our Surroundings," where students explored the physical nature of matter through engaging, hands-on activities. To move beyond theoretical concepts, the session was designed to demonstrate the fundamental characteristics of particles through direct observation. By witnessing the diffusion of ink in water and the spread of fragrance, students observed that particles are constantly moving, while the dissolution of salt in a fixed volume of water without a rise in level clearly illustrated that particles have space between them. Additionally, a continuous dilution experiment with potassium permanganate showed that even a tiny crystal can color a large volume of water, proving that particles of matter are incredibly small. This interactive approach across all three sections effectively bridged the gap between microscopic theories and macroscopic observations, sparking significant curiosity and providing a solid foundation for the upcoming study of the states of matter.



ATL SESSION VI

An introductory class was conducted for Class VI C students at the Atal Tinkering Lab today. The session aimed to familiarize students with Atal Tinkering Lab, an initiative by Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), which fosters curiosity, creativity, and innovation. Students learned about the lab's purpose - to encourage hands-on learning, problem-solving, and application of STEM concepts. 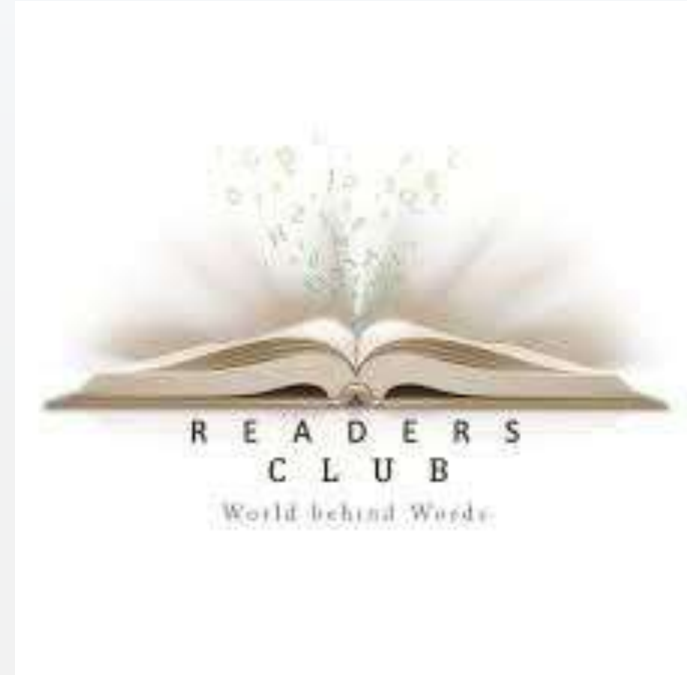
TECHSPARK- COMPUTER CLUB VI-VIII

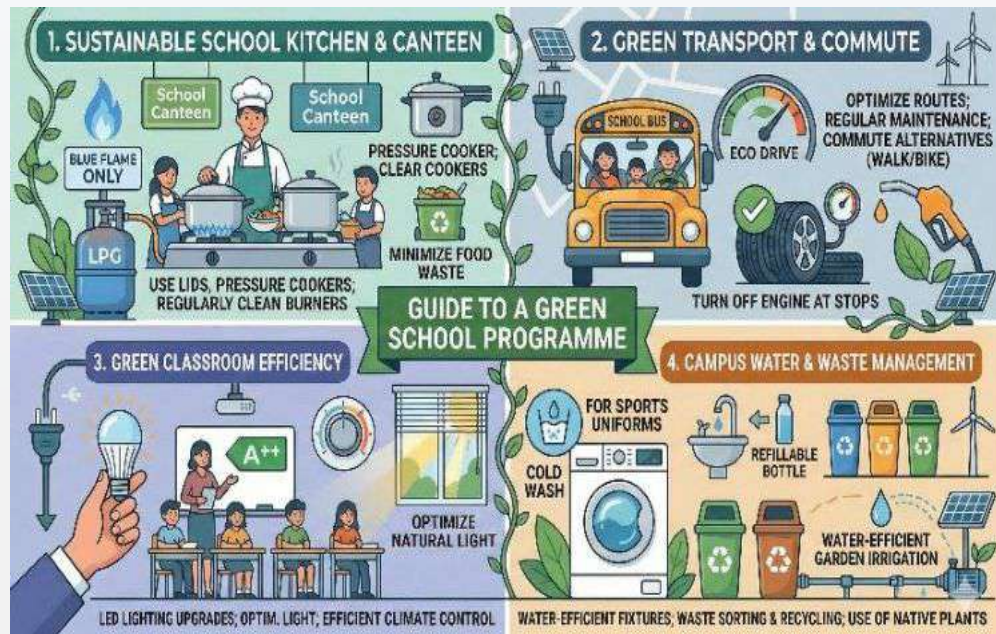
RANGMANCH- HINDI THEATRE CLUB VI-VIII

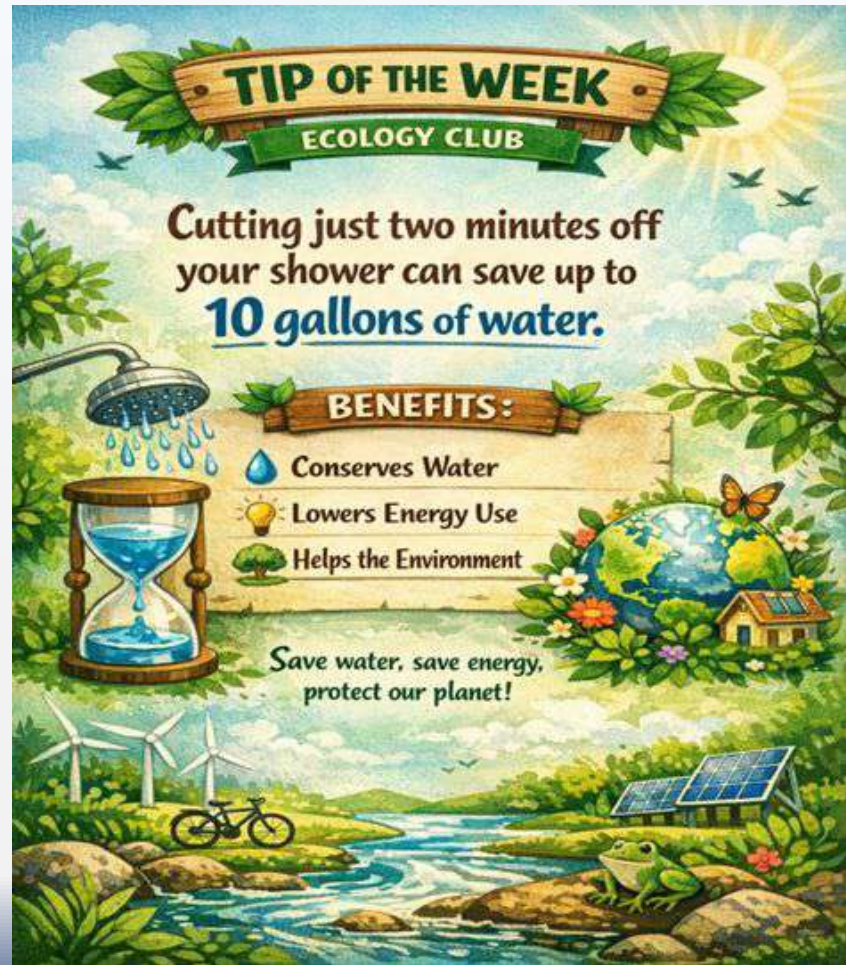
