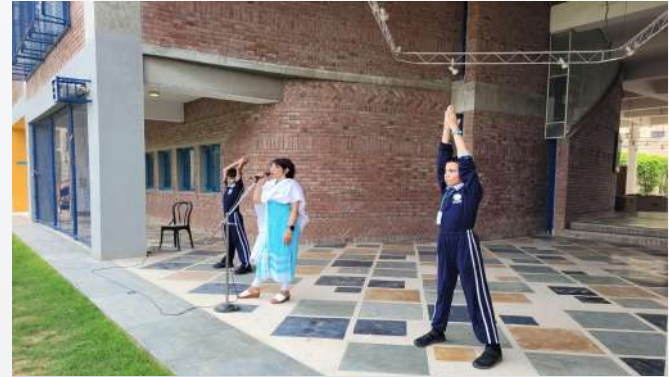
# OPEN FORUM VI-VIII
