NURSERY



ENGLISH

This week, students revised letter M and completed worksheets. Through diverse activities, including sand and salt writing, they reinforced letter recognition and practiced revision of previous letters, enhancing their phonetic awareness and fine motor skills.

HINDI

This week, the students were introduced to the letter ज्ञ. They engaged in colouring worksheets and learned related vocabulary. Students also revised previous letters, reinforcing their foundational language skills. The interactive approach facilitated effective learning and reinforced their understanding of the alphabets.



MATH

This week, nursery students were introduced to the number 7. Related worksheets were completed, and a revision of previous numbers was done using the Magic Box, making learning engaging and interactive.



GENERAL AWARENESS

Students explored good habits through colourful worksheets. They learned about oral hygiene, cleanliness and handwashing. Students understood the importance of these habits in maintaining health and developing responsibility. Interactive activities reinforced their learning, fostering a strong foundation for good habits and a healthy lifestyle.



SCIENCE DEMONSTRATION

This week, students explored the properties of Air through engaging rhymes and hands-on activities. The blowing of bubbles and balloons demonstrated air's presence and occupation of space. Students developed scientific awareness and curiosity about the natural world, grasping the importance of air in our life.



KINDERGARTEN

ENGLISH

Students were introduced to a new story **My Pet Dog** as part of Reading Scheme class. The students made good efforts to narrate the story using props and later individually tried reading from the book.



HINDI

This week, the vyanjan letter न was introduced. Students practiced writing both न and भ in their workbooks and notebooks. They also revised previously learned vyanjan letters: क, व, ब, ग, and म simultaneously to strengthen their understanding and handwriting practice.



GENERAL AWARENESS

This week, students learned about the various festivals celebrated across India throughout the year. They also explored the difference between national and religious festivals. Additionally, students enjoyed colouring activities on different festival-themed pages, making the learning experience more engaging and fun.



CIRCLE TIME

This week in circle time, the teacher discussed the national and religious festivals of India, encouraging the kids to share their own experiences and knowledge. The session was filled with excitement as they talked about celebrations, traditions, and the joy these festivals bring.



DANCE

This week in dance class, the kids danced with energy and excitement. Their enthusiasm helped them learn various steps as they moved to the lively beats, making each step full of fun and joy.



MUSIC

This week in music class, the kids practiced alankars to improve their singing skills, followed by learning the melodious song "Aaiye Aapka Karte Hain Swagat" with great enthusiasm.





ENGLISH

Students completed worksheets on the topic of *is*, *am*, and *are*. They learned how to use these words correctly in context. Following this, they were introduced to a new topic of *this* and *that*. The fun related exercise helped them to understand better the correct usage of the concepts taught.

Additionally, students tried to read blend words, practicing their phonics skills and improving their reading fluency.



HINDI

This week in Hindi, students completed worksheets related to the vowel आ की मात्रा. They also practiced reading of चार अक्षर वाले शब्द from *Shabd Parichay*. These activities helped improve their reading fluency, pronunciation, and word recognition. Regular reading practice also boosted their confidence in identifying and reading longer Hindi words.



MATH

This week the students did worksheets on between and after number concepts. They also practiced missing numbers in their notebooks and practiced after numbers on the board. These activities helped them understand number order, improve their counting skills, and build better focus and confidence with numbers.



GENERAL AWARENESS

As part of General Awareness the students worked on worksheets related to community helpers. They matched pictures of community helpers with their occupation and wrote some difficult words in their notebooks. Through these activities, the students learned to recognize different community helpers and understand their roles in our daily lives. These tasks helped build awareness, observation, and respect for the people who help in the community.



ART & CRAFT

This week, students in an art and craft session drew a caterpillar and an apple in their art files. They coloured their drawings and thoroughly enjoyed the activity. Through drawing and colouring, they enhanced their fine motor skills, creativity, and focus. In celebration of Independence Day, students also participated in a special craft activity where they made a kite according to the colours of the tricolour. This hands-on activity helped develop their fine motor coordination while also fostering a sense of patriotism and teamwork.



SAND PIT

This week, the students had a great time at the sand pit, where they creatively molded and shaped the sand into different forms. The splash pool session was just as enjoyable, offering a fun-filled experience that supported sensory exploration and helped develop their gross motor skills in a cheerful and engaging setting.

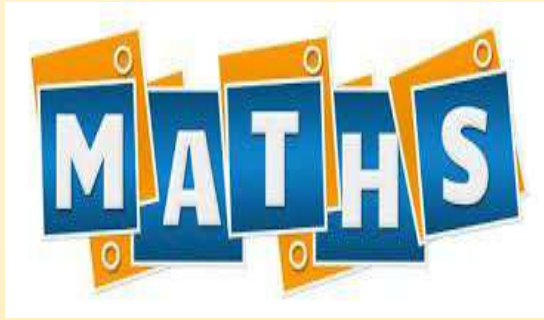




हिन्दी

This week, our Class I students joyfully practiced skip counting by 3s, reciting the multiplication table of 3 with growing confidence and enthusiasm. They also explored number names and the tens-and-ones concept for numbers 50 to 59, reinforcing their understanding of place value. Skip counting is not just a fun exercise—it builds strong number sense, lays the foundation for multiplication, and aids in recognizing number patterns.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

This week, our curious students embarked on an enriching journey through the chapter on Food. They were told about protective food, body-building food, and energy-giving food through a lively and fun exercise. To express their understanding creatively, the students drew colorful healthy plates depicting a balanced mix of these three food groups. Their vibrant artwork beautifully showcased how a well-balanced diet powers growth, boosts immunity, and fuels energy—making abstract concepts come alive in a fun, memorable way.





हिन्दी

इस सप्ताह कक्षा 2 के विद्यार्थियों ने "तिरंगा झंडा" विषयक कविता का स्वर वाचन बहुत ही उमंग और भावुकता से प्रस्तुत किया। उन्होंने इस कविता के माध्यम से तीनों रंगों—केसरिया (साहस का प्रतीक), सफेद (शांति का प्रतीक) और हरा (समृद्धि का प्रतीक)—की महत्ता को समझा और भावपूर्ण ढंग से व्यक्त किया। इसके साथ ही, विद्यार्थियों ने कविता से प्रेरित होकर अपने कापी में चित्रण और लेखन कार्य किया, जिसमें उन्होंने कविता की भावनाओं को अपनी कल्पना और रचनात्मकता से अभिव्यक्त किया। बच्चों ने व्याकरण अभ्यास के अंतर्गत 'लिंग बदलो' और 'वचन बदलो' के अभ्यास भी पूरी लगन के साथ किए, जिससे उनके भाषा ज्ञान में और भी स्पष्टता और आत्मविश्वास आया।





This week, our enthusiastic Class II students delved into Lesson 5, a poem in their curriculum. They immersed themselves in understanding the rhythm, nuanced meanings, and expressive tone of each line. Reciting aloud with focus not only deepened their comprehension but also nurtured a sensitive appreciation for poetic language. Simultaneously, students reviewed all the new vocabulary introduced in August, reinforcing word recognition and retention.





This week, Class 2 students had a productive Math class, covering several key topics. They revised tables from 5 to 9, practiced Vertical Multiplication with and without regrouping, and worked on Word problems. Additionally, they revisited Subtraction concepts through revision exercises, reinforcing their understanding of these essential math skills.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Our Class II students have just wrapped up the chapter "**Work and Play**" in Environmental Studies with impressive enthusiasm and understanding. Through interactive discussions and hands-on activities, they explored the key distinctions between **work** and **play**.

To make learning more engaging, the children participated in a **Fun Board Game Session**. In this enjoyable class activity, they played their favourite board games together—building not only their enjoyment but also valuable life skills.

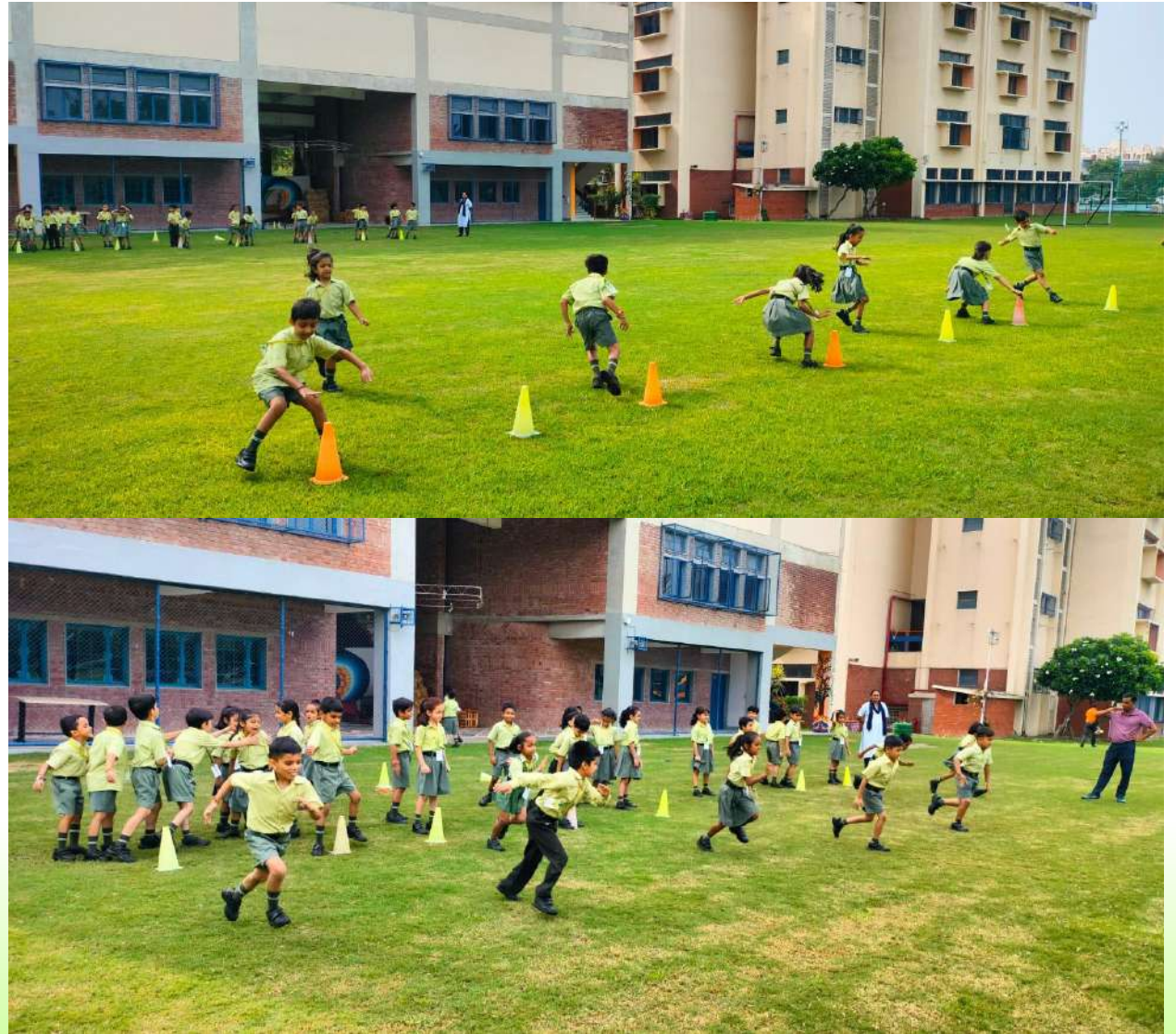
COMPUTER CLASS 2

हिन्दी

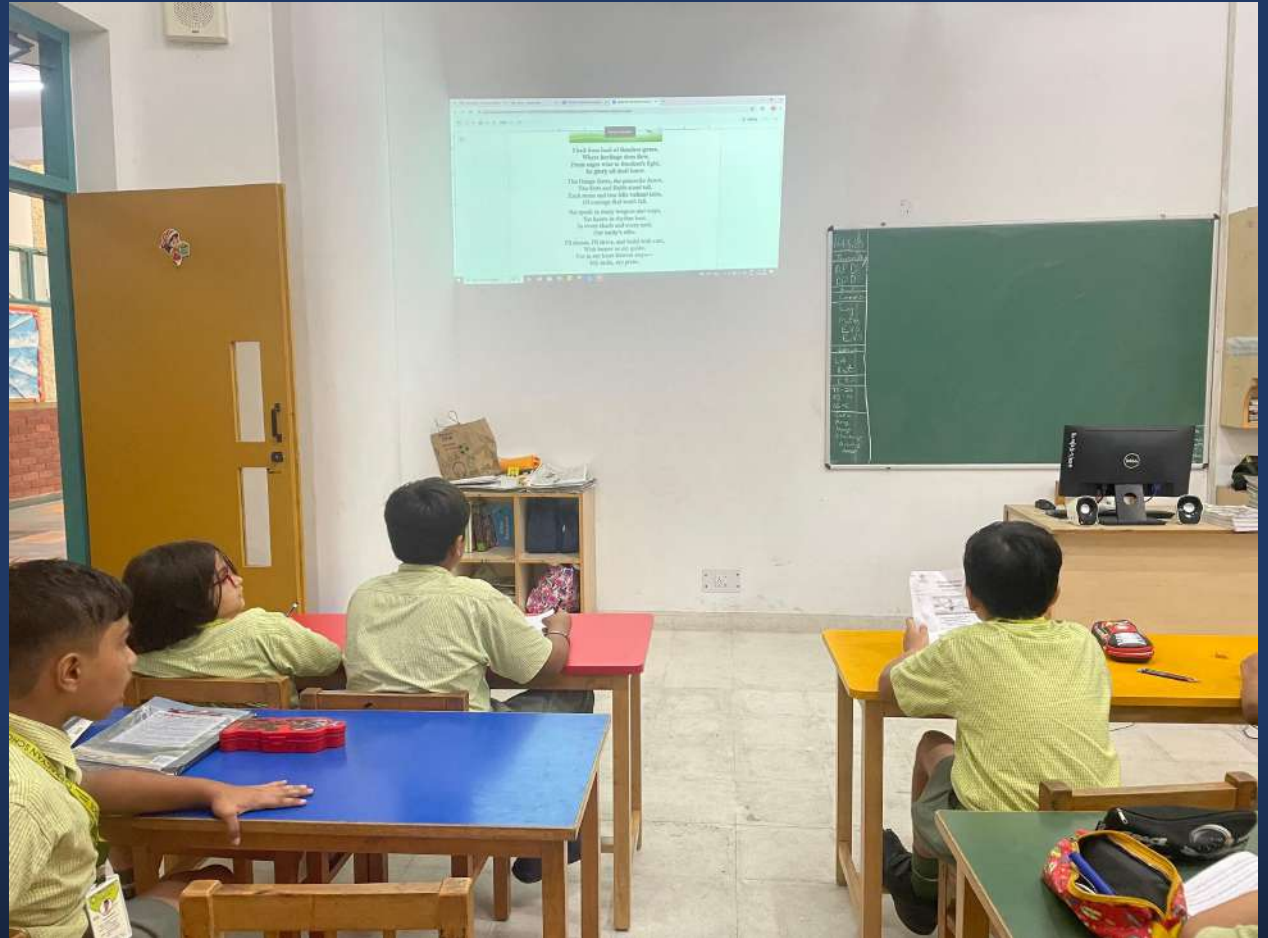
ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

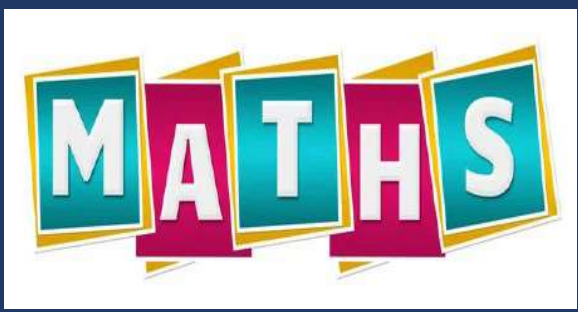




हिन्दी

ART & CRAFT

Students of Grades 3 to 5 are actively engaged in diverse and enriching art activities. A few sections of Grade 3 have started working on a painting inspired by the Indian folk art style of Jamini Roy, focusing on bold outlines, flat colors, and traditional Indian expressions to explore cultural elements through creative composition. In Grade 4, some sections have begun vibrant portrait paintings inspired by the renowned Mexican artist Frida Kahlo, introducing students to global art influences while emphasizing facial expression, decorative patterns, and bold use of color. Grade 5 students have started working on a painting inspired by “The Starry Night” by the legendary artist Vincent van Gogh, exploring post-impressionist techniques, expressive brushwork, and the use of vivid colors to convey emotion.

LIBRARY

A Student of class 5 summarized the book “Bhagat Singh” published by Maple press . Bhagat Singh was an Indian revolutionary whose activism against British rule in India is highly regarded. Born in 1907, he was deeply influenced by his family's history of resistance and the atrocities inflicted by the British. He actively participated in the Indian independence movement, engaging in acts of defiance like the Saunders murder and the bombing of the central legislative assembly to protest British policies. His hunger strike in jail, alongside fellow prisoners, further fueled his popularity and solidified his image as a martyr. Bhagat Singh was executed by the British at the age of 23, becoming a symbol of resistance and a folk hero for many in India. It is a worth reading book.
