# NURSERY



## ENGLISH

Students learned the letter B through worksheets and writing practice. They revised previous letters and enhanced learning using the Magic Box and a story based on letter B. This engaging approach reinforced new concepts and promoted an interactive learning experience.



# HINDI

In Hindi, students explored the new letter **इ** this week. They coloured related words in their worksheet. To make learning fun, jadui pitara activity was incorporated, which enhanced their understanding. Regular revision of previous letters ensured reinforcement of their existing knowledge.



# MATH

Nursery students were introduced to the number 14 through engaging activities this week. They practiced writing the number using sandpaper tracing and completed worksheets to reinforce their understanding. A revision of previous numbers was conducted, ensuring a strong foundation in numeracy skills and building confidence in mathematics.



# GENERAL AWARENESS

In general awareness, students learned about transportation and traffic rules. They crafted traffic lights and explored their uses. Through interactive activities, they understood the importance of traffic lights. This hands-on approach helped them grasp essential concepts, promoting safe and responsible behavior on roads.



# SCIENCE DEMO

Students of nursery participated in a science demonstration on living and non-living things. They learned about characteristics like breathing, growth, movement, and emotions, enabling them to differentiate between living and non-living entities. Interactive examples and engaging activities helped students grasp these concepts.



# ORATORY SKILLS

As part of oratory skills, nursery students learned and confidently practiced basic lines about transportation. This exercise enhanced their vocabulary and public speaking skills, enabling them to express themselves clearly and build confidence in communication.



# JADUI PITARA

The Jadui Pitara activity enabled students to engage with stories based on various letters, facilitating vocabulary expansion and linguistic development. This interactive approach fostered enhanced learning skills, promoting a strong foundation in language acquisition and literacy skills for the young learners.



# HANDS ON ACTIVITY

Students played the Pick and Sit game, and this hands-on activity aimed to recognize and associate alphabets with sounds. Students enjoyed the interactive game, enhancing their learning experience and alphabet recognition skills. Additionally, the Buckle My Shoe activity developed their fine motor skills as they learned to buckle and unbuckle their shoes, promoting independence and self-care. These activities fostered cognitive and motor skill development.



# KINDERGARTEN

## ENGLISH



The children were engaged enthusiastically in written practice, focusing on **ab**, **ed**, and **ar** family words throughout the week. It was wonderful to see their growing confidence and enjoyment as they built and used new words with increasing ease.

# HINDI

This week, the children were introduced to the letter य and continued their practice with the letter श and two-letter words. Colouring of object pictures related to these letters made it fun while learning. It was delightful to see their enthusiasm and steady progress in recognizing and using these letters confidently.



# MATH

This week, the children embarked on an exciting number journey as they learned to count backward from 100 to 0 and practiced skip counting by 2s. Through interactive games and hands-on activities, they explored numbers with great enthusiasm. It helped them to strengthen their understanding of counting concepts.



# GENERAL AWARENESS

This week, the children learned about the meaning of transportation and explored different means and ways of transport. They enjoyed colouring pictures related to the theme, making the learning both enjoyable and interactive.



# SKILL BASED LEARNING

This week, the children attended a skill-based class where they learned about different gardening tools. With the help of the school gardener, they observed each tool closely and understood its use through simple demonstrations.



# SCIENCE DEMO

This week in the science demonstration class, the children explored the concept of living and non-living things through exciting hands-on activities. They picked up picture flashcards one by one and confidently identified whether each object was living or non-living. The activity sparked great curiosity and helped them understand the topic in a fun and interactive way.



# ORATORY SKILLS

This week in Oratory, the children creatively narrated the story of *The Honest Woodcutter*. Using props, they performed with confidence and expressive storytelling, bringing the tale to life. It was delightful to watch them engage so enthusiastically while learning the important value of honesty.





# ENGLISH

This week in English, students did opposite words in their notebooks and completed worksheets related to *ck* and *ng* sound words. The concept of *a* and *an* was introduced, and they did related exercises in their notebooks. These activities improved their reading and writing skills and helped them enhance their understanding of phonics, vocabulary, and basic grammar concepts.

# HINDI

This week in Hindi, students did worksheets related to इ की मात्रा and matched words with the correct pictures in their notebooks. They also tried to make sentences by using the given words. These activities improved their reading and writing skills and enhanced their understanding of matra, word recognition, and sentence formation.



# MATH

This week in Maths, students did single and double-digit additions in their notebooks. They also practiced what comes in between from 181 to 200 and did skip counting by 2's in their notebooks. Related worksheets were also completed that helped improve their number sense, calculation, and problem-solving skills.



# GENERAL AWARENESS

As part of their general awareness activities, students completed a worksheet related to food and participated in a lively discussion on the topic. They also worked on true or false exercises in their notebooks. These activities enhanced their thinking and speaking skills while deepening their understanding of the importance of food in our daily lives.



# VALUE BASED STORY

This week, in the value-based story session, the children were introduced to *The Clever Cleaner*. They enjoyed listening to the story and later brought it to life by enacting it using props. These activities not only strengthened their listening and speaking skills but also boosted their confidence, creativity, and imagination, while deepening their understanding of important moral values.



# DANCE

In dance class, students practiced energetic moves to a Diwali-themed song. They thoroughly enjoyed learning new steps and moving gracefully to the rhythm of the music. The activity helped enhance their coordination, body balance, and sense of rhythm, while also boosting their confidence and expressive skills through dance.



# INTER CLASS ACTIVITY - NUMBER FUN

On Wednesday, 16th October, the students of the Nursery, Kindergarten and Upper Kindergarten participated in an Inter-Class Activity featuring a fun number game and math-based quiz designed to reinforce their numerical skills. All students took part enthusiastically, displaying great team spirit and a healthy sense of competition. The activity encouraged learning through play while promoting confidence and collaboration. Winners will be soon awarded certificates.



# HANDS ON ACTIVITY

This week in English, students practiced the use of 'a' and 'an' along with previously learned sounds. These activities strengthened their understanding of articles, improved sound recognition, and supported their reading and sentence-building skills. In Hindi, students worked on आ, इ और ई मात्रा, which enhanced their matra recognition and further developed their reading and writing abilities.



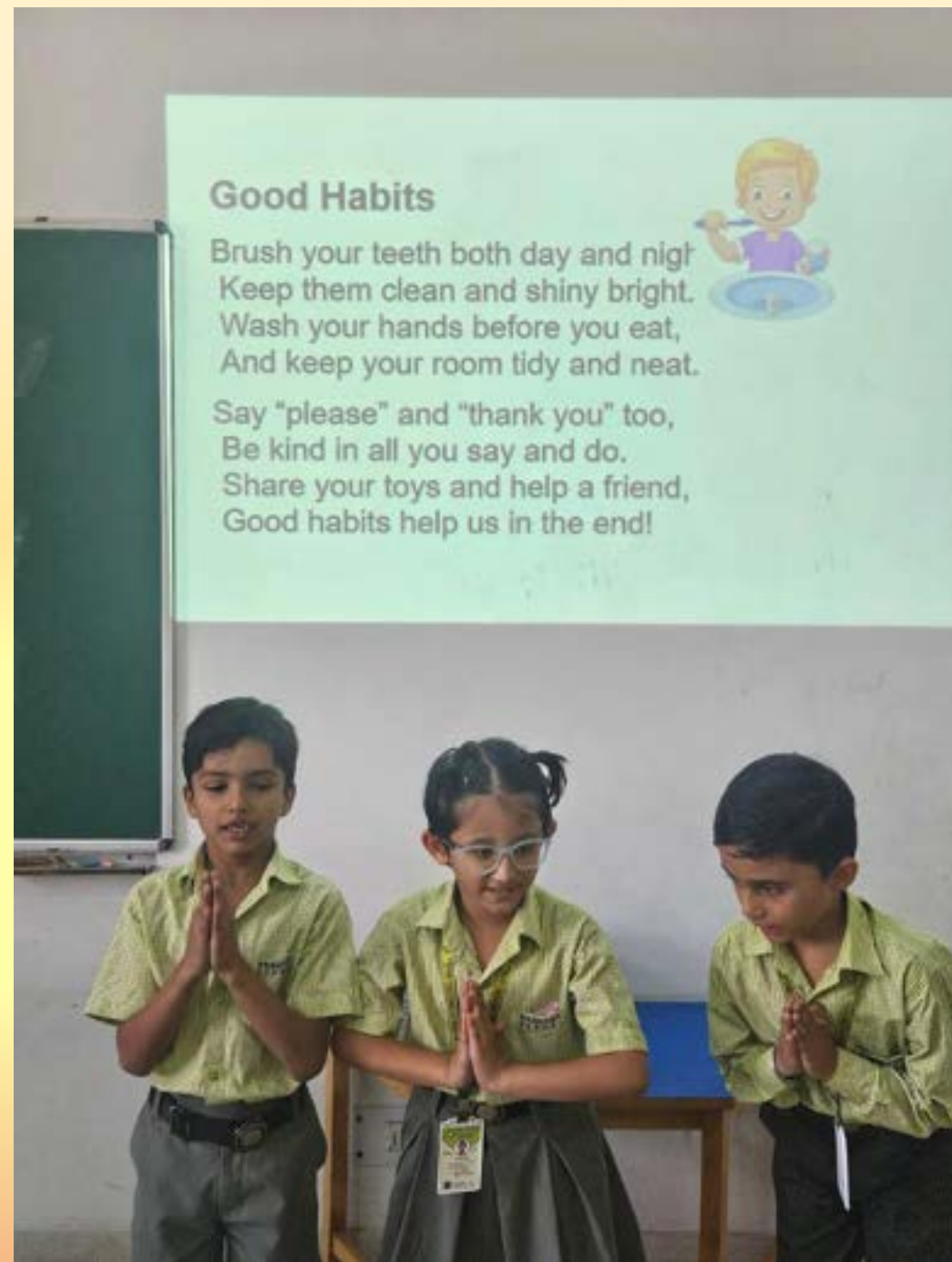
# CIRCLE TIME

This week during circle time, the children participated in a lively discussion about healthy food, junk food, and different food groups. They eagerly shared their ideas and learned about the importance of eating nutritious meals. The activity not only deepened their understanding of healthy eating and balanced living but also helped strengthen their listening and speaking skills.





The week began with a quick revision of Naming Words along with oral sentence practice, helping students strengthen their basic grammar skills. They continued their learning with workbook exercises on prepositions and practiced forming simple sentences orally. Reading comprehension was enhanced through the engaging story “*Mina and the Mango Tree*,” which the students thoroughly enjoyed. The week concluded with a fun revision of punctuation through interactive oral activities, making learning both engaging and effective.





The students of class 1 were introduced to the concept of subtraction. To begin with, their previous knowledge of basic subtraction facts was checked through oral drills and simple written exercises. This helped the children recall what they had already learned and prepared them for new concepts. They were introduced to subtraction with borrowing, where they learned to regroup numbers while solving two-digits. They practiced these sums through classroom activities, worksheets, and hands-on examples using objects and number cards, which made learning more enjoyable. Children also revised the concept of place value, reinforcing their understanding of tens and ones to help them perform subtraction more accurately.





# ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The week began with a revision of new words, followed by a thoughtful exploration of the chapter “Taking Care of the Environment.” The students enjoyed reading the chapter and actively participated in the class discussion. An AIL activity added a creative touch to the topic, allowing children to express their understanding through art and ideas. They also enthusiastically took part in the Speaking Spark activity on “How to Take Care of the Environment.”





Students of class 2 revised the poem and new words of the month. They were introduced to articles and vowels and learned how to use the articles in sentences. They also did the reading activity of the chapter to enhance their reading and comprehension followed by some related exercises.

# COMPUTER CLASS 1 & 2



The students of Classes 1 and 2 explored the world of technology with great excitement during their Computer periods. They learnt how to use MS Word and enjoyed typing a short paragraph on the topic “My Garden.” This activity not only enhanced their typing skills but also helped them express their thoughts creatively using the computer.

# PHYSICAL EDUCATION

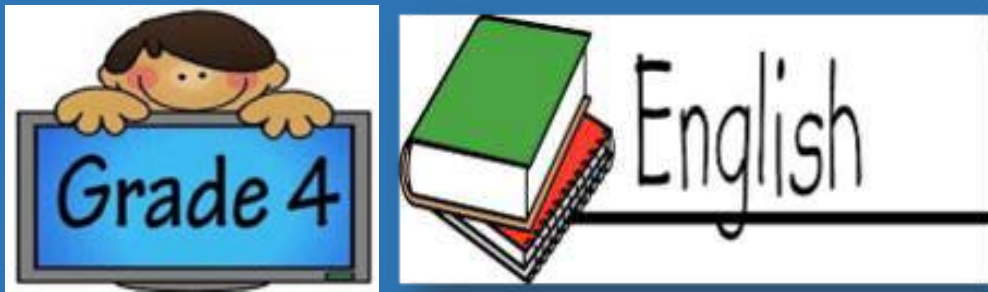




# ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The students of Grade 3 were introduced to the chapter **The Human Body**. The class has begun exploring the fascinating world of human anatomy. # ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE
