NURSERY



DANCE

KINDERGARTEN



ENGLISH

The students revised capital letters A to Z by identifying and filling in the missing letters in their English workbook. This engaging exercise helped reinforce their alphabet recognition and improves their writing skills.

MATHS

The students were asked to count various objects and tick the correct numbers in their Maths workbook. They enjoyed the activity as it included fun and colourful items like ice creams, lollipops, cupcakes and more.



PUPPET SHOW

The story 'The Sky is Falling Down' was brought to life by the teachers, who skillfully enacted various animal characters. The students thoroughly enjoyed the story enactment, and were then engaged in a lively discussion as they answered several questions related to the tale.



CRAFT

The students of Kindergarten were excited to create hens and chicks using their handprints during craft class. They also enjoyed making photo frames in their scrapbook by drawing their own pictures and colouring them creatively, using colours of their choice.



DANCE

This week, our kindergarteners had a delightful time exploring the world of rhythm through fun-filled dance classes. Moving to peppy beats and cheerful tunes, the little ones learned basic steps, improved coordination, and most importantly, enjoyed expressing themselves through music.



ESAP

ENGLISH

The students thoroughly reviewed the alphabet, focusing on phonics to improve pronunciation and recognition. This review was complemented by a revision of consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) words, which helped strengthen their reading skills. By reinforcing their understanding of phonics and CVC words, the students enhanced their overall linguistic proficiency.

MATHS

The students revisited the fundamentals of counting, meticulously reviewing numbers from 1 to 100. This exercise was augmented by an engaging activity where they arranged numbers in the correct sequence, thereby reinforcing their understanding of numerical order and patterns. Through this hands-on experience, the students solidified their grasp of counting concepts.



EASP

The students participated in various sports and games, promoting teamwork, coordination, and physical fitness. As they ran, jumped, and played, it helped in developing their motor skills and overall well-being.



DANCE

The students danced with infectious energy to a vibrant Celebration song, their feet moving in perfect syncopation. The music's lively beat and joyful melody ignited their spirits, and they let loose, twirling and spinning with abandon.



GENERAL AWARENESS

The students explored the fascinating world of body parts and sense organs, learning about the functions of eyes, ears, nose, tongue, and skin. To reinforce their understanding, they participated in hands-on activities that stimulated their senses, such as identifying different smells, tastes, and textures. The interactive activities made learning fun and memorable, leaving a lasting impression on the students.



YOGA

During yoga class, students practiced the Trikon pose, also known as the Triangle Pose. This foundational posture improves flexibility, balance, and strength, while also stretching the hips and spine. With careful guidance from the teacher, the students worked to perfect their form, breathing deeply and smoothly as they extended their arms and legs into the triangular shape. The Trikon pose is a great way to cultivate physical awareness, calmness, and focus.



INTER CLASS ACTIVITY I CAN COLOUR

As part of their first Inter class activity students Nursery, Kindergarten and Upper Kindergarten participated in "I Can Colour" conducted on 9th April, 2025. The students were given prior practice on the same during school hours. This activity enabled students to explore their imagination and express their unique perspectives through colours. The winners of the activity will soon be awarded with the certificates of merit based on the neatness and presentation.



PUPPET SHOW

In a delightful educational exercise, teachers brought to life the timeless tale of 'The Stork and the Fox'. With flair and finesse, they enacted the story, captivating their students' imagination and attention. The story allowed the young learners to absorb valuable lessons on wit, intelligence, and adaptability. Through this engaging performance, the teachers successfully conveyed the story's morals, leaving a lasting impression on their students.



CLASS ASSEMBLY (UKG)

Students of UKG began with their assembly, with a prayer and invigorating exercises, getting their hearts racing and energizing their bodies. Furthermore, we began Chapter 1: "My Family," where students practiced simple sentences describing their family members.

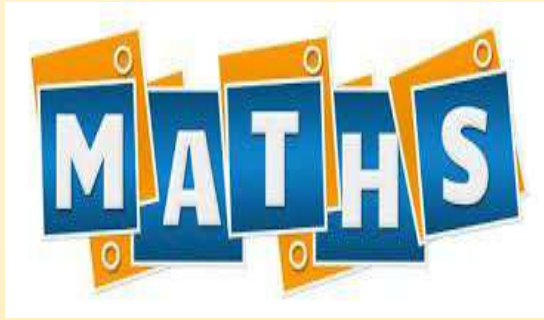




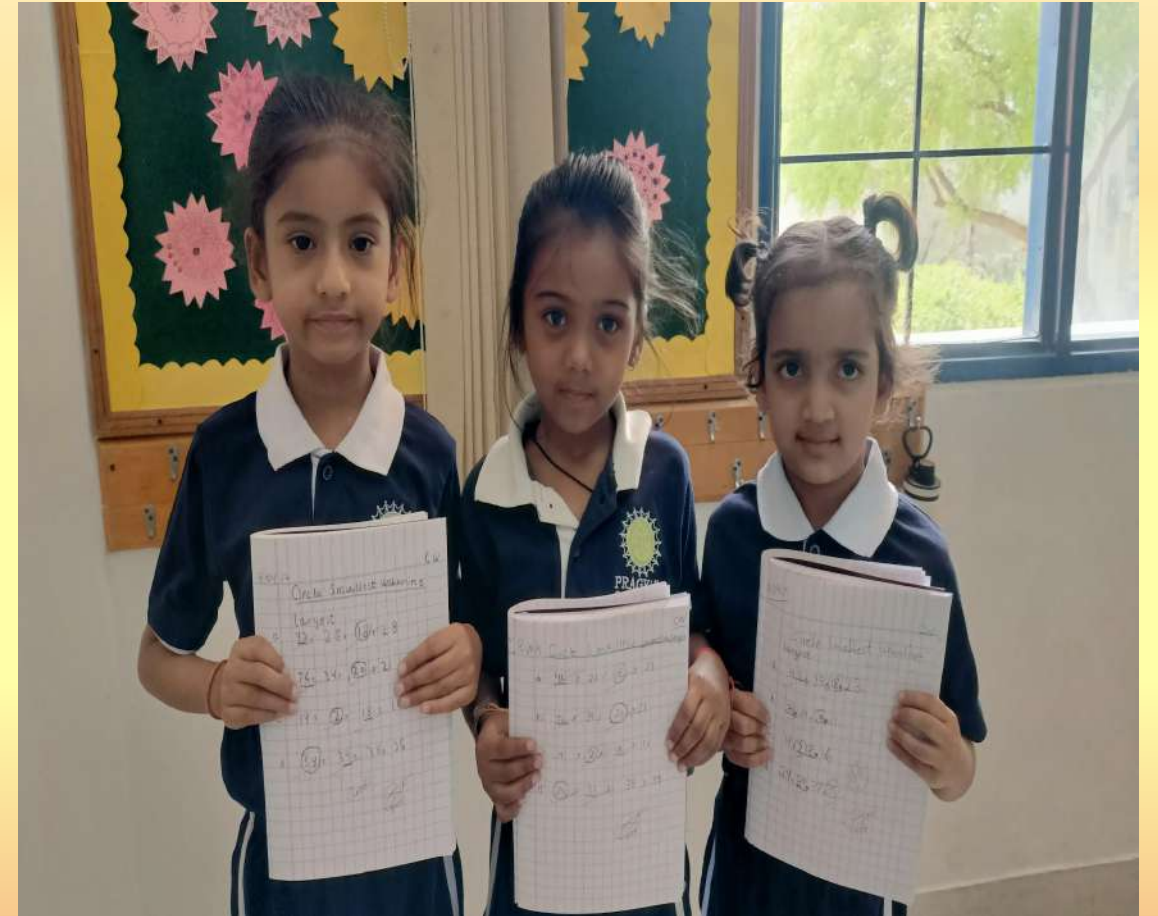
ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

This week, students of class 1 read the chapter: My Body from the textbook. They explored the five sense organs and understood their functions and importance. They also learned the names of the fingers and studied the different parts of the arm and leg. Additionally, they were introduced to tongue map and how it relates to different tastes.





Identifying the largest and smallest numbers is a fundamental mathematical skill with various real-world applications, from simple comparisons to complex data analysis. Understanding these concepts helps in ordering numbers, understanding place value, and solving problems involving comparisons. Children of class 1 enjoyed revising the concept of before \ after \ between, largest number, smallest number, simple addition done in the previous class. Related questions were done in books and notebooks.

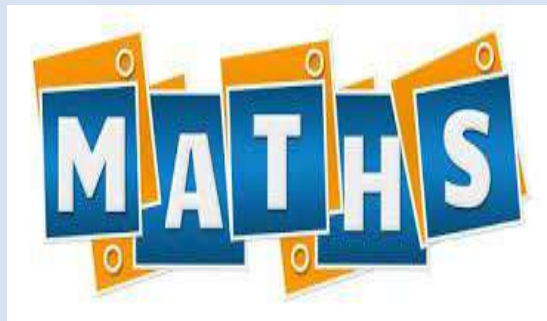
Students of class 2 revised their poem of the month. They were introduced to the new words and did the related exercises in the textbook from the chapter- The Little Plant. They also practiced making sentences from the given words in their notebooks. Additionally they did a few exercises in their workbooks as well. They also drew the life cycle of a plant as pictorial presentation of the story.





Being able to identify body parts is important for children because it allows them to start developing a sense of body awareness. Students of class 2 read the chapter My Body during their EVS class. They were also shown some videos related to the topic. Students enjoyed identifying and drawing various sense organs. They also practiced new words in the classroom.





This week, Class 2 students made significant progress in their numeracy skills. They practiced writing number names up to one thousand and completed exercises focusing on 'before,' 'after,' and 'between' concepts within the range of 1-1000.



INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC (1&2)



Exposing children to music in their early developmental stages greatly enhances their ability to identify and process sounds. This week, during musical instrument class, students of classes 1 and 2 learned how to play Alankar on the keyboard and were guided how to focus on rhythm.

DANCE

Class 1 students learned new dance steps through various characters of the story. They also practiced simple foot steps on counts and drum beats.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION (1 & 2)

Throwing and catching are fundamental movement skills crucial for children's development, impacting their gross and fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and overall physical and mental well-being. They form the basis for many games and sports and are essential for developing a lifelong active lifestyle. Children of class 1 and 2 enjoyed doing catch and throw along with regular exercises.



CLASS ASSEMBLY (2A)

School assemblies play a key role in helping kids develop discipline, responsibility, and teamwork. They offer a chance for students to engage with their peers, embrace new values, and stay informed about school events, all while fostering a positive school environment. On April 7th and 8th, 2025, Class 2 A presented their assembly on the theme of friendship. The assembly began with morning exercises and a prayer, followed by the sharing of thoughts and news. Students delivered a talk on the psychological significance of friendship, accompanied by a poem. A fun riddles session was also organized, which the students thoroughly enjoyed.

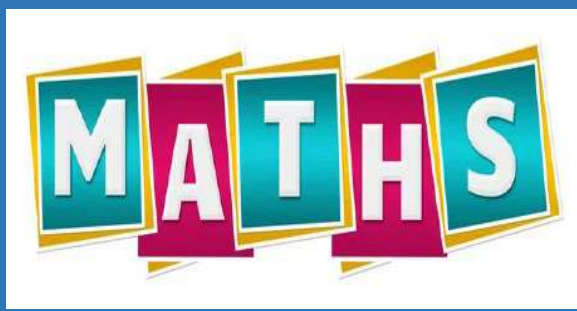

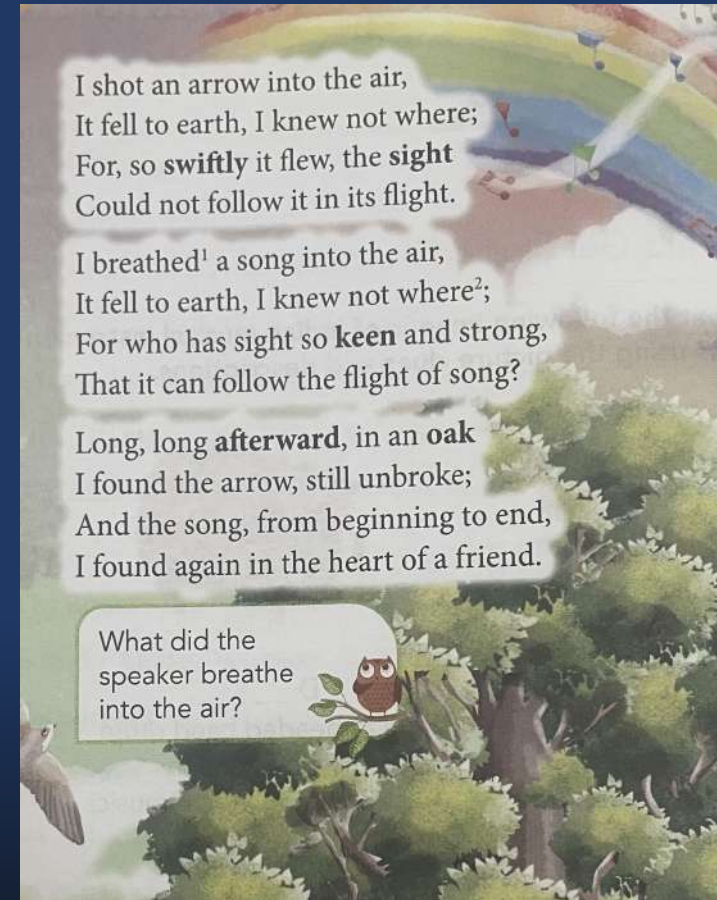
ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

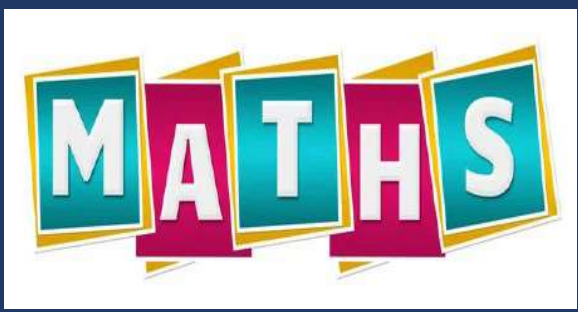
