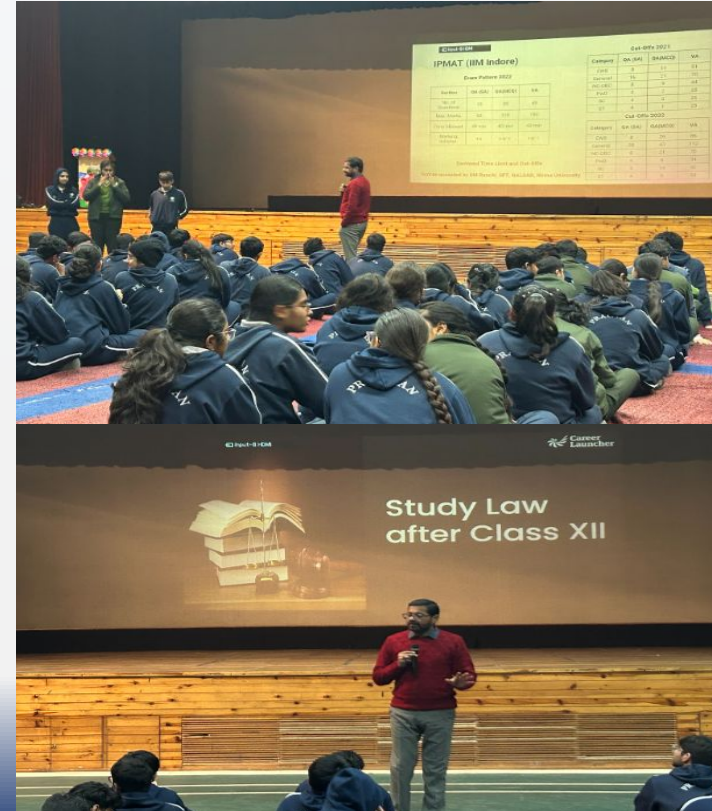
The conference was truly insightful and informative as students vividly presented their reflection on the said topic.

The session was conducted by Mr. Ramanuj Mishra, the Director of Career Launcher, who provided a detailed and comprehensive understanding of the importance, structure, and preparation strategies for these exams. A significant portion of the workshop was dedicated to IPMAT, which Mr. Mishra described as a promising pathway for students aspiring to pursue management studies. Health and Wellness club conducted an event during the club meeting. The event focused on promoting healthy living, personal well-being, and self-care practices among students of Classes VI-VIII. The activities conducted, such as creating health goals charts, learning about the human body, and preparing first aid boxes, seem to have achieved the desired objective. The outcome of the event is impressive, with students developing essential life skills, a sense of health responsibility, and self-care practices.



SCIENCE CLUB VI-VIII: THE INNOVATORS

The Science Club conducted a hands-on session to explore key scientific principles through models and experiments. Each offering valuable insights into real-world applications.

The hydraulic bridge model demonstrated how pressure can lift and lower bridges effectively. Participants learned about its significance in modern infrastructure. The jumping frog activity illustrated the transformation of elastic potential energy into kinetic energy using ring magnets, making physics fun and engaging. A working model of a dam highlighted water storage and hydroelectric power generation, emphasizing the importance of dams in energy production and irrigation while also discussing their environmental impact. The electromagnet experiment, made with a simple coil of wire and a battery, showcased how electric current generates magnetic fields, highlighting its applications in cranes and motors. Finally, the concept of carbon dioxide demineralization was explored. A demonstration of mineral carbonation explained how CO_2 can be captured and stored as stable carbonates, a potential solution for combating climate change.
