PRAGYAN PLUS INITIATIVE: SCULPTURE WORKSHOP

Pragyan School successfully conducted a **three-day Sculpture Workshop** from **26th to 28th November** within the school premises. The workshop was organised in collaboration with the **School of Fine Arts & Design (SOFAD), Noida International University**, under the mentorship of their faculty members. The workshop aimed to introduce students to the fundamentals of **three-dimensional art**, enhance creative expression, and provide hands-on experience in sculpting techniques. Students from **Classes VI to XII** enthusiastically participated, making the event highly interactive and vibrant. Under the guidance of **SOFAD faculty** and BFA/MFA student instructors, participants explored various methods of sculpting using clay and other basic materials. Students learned about:

- Basic tools and techniques of sculpture

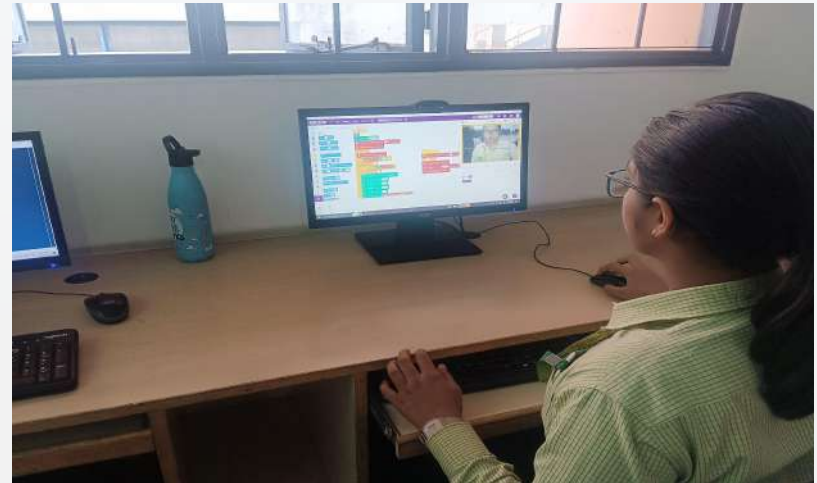
SCIENCE CLUB VI-VIII: THE INNOVATORS

Students gained experience identifying acidic and basic substances. The activity promoted scientific inquiry and critical thinking. The recent Science Club session in VII-VIII was dedicated to an engaging, cross-grade brainstorming focused on developing innovative, functional models utilizing new technologies



COMPUTER CLUB VI-VIII: TECHSPARK

Students of classes 6–8 have been learning to create a Face-Detection Attendance System. They successfully understood how a camera detects and recognizes faces to mark attendance automatically. Today, they moved a step further by learning how to link their project with a CSV file, allowing the system to store names, dates, and attendance records in a structured format. This hands-on activity helped them understand how modern digital attendance systems work and how data is saved for future use.

ECOLOGY CLUB IX-XII: GREEN WARRIORS

The students of the Ecology Club conducted an enriching visit to the school's compost pit, medicinal nursery, and organic farming field to observe the ongoing progress of their environmental initiatives. During the visit, students explored the compost pit and learned how biodegradable waste is converted into nutrient-rich manure, reinforcing their understanding of sustainable waste management practices. They then visited the medicinal nursery, where they observed the healthy growth of various medicinal plants and understood their importance in promoting traditional healing practices and biodiversity conservation. On the other hand, students against the motion highlighted that the education system is evolving, offering skill-based learning and opportunities for independent thinking.



INTERACT CLUB IX-XII: HELPING HANDS

In the club period, the interactors discussed on the purpose of the drive collecting warm clothes for underprivileged individuals in the community as winter approaches. Members emphasized the importance of encouraging maximum participation from students, staff, and parents to ensure the success of the initiative.
