NURSERY



ENGLISH

Students had an exciting week introducing the letter M and revising A. Engaging worksheets, sand, and salt tray tracing activities made learning interactive. Students enthusiastically practiced letter formation, developing fine motor skills and phonetic awareness.



HINDI

This week, students were introduced to the letter **ख**. They enthusiastically coloured the related worksheet and learned vocabulary words. Revision of previously taught letters was also conducted to reinforce recognition and recall. The activities enhanced their letter-sound association and fine motor skills.



MATH

The nursery students had a productive week, learning the number 6, completing related worksheets and revising previous numbers to reinforce their understanding and build a strong foundation.



CIRCLE TIME

This week, students learned about good habits during circle time, focusing on brushing teeth, cleaning the home and classroom, and washing hands which promoted awareness and encouraged healthy habits among students.



VALUE BASED STORY

The nursery class enjoyed the value-based story **The Greedy Dog** with puppets and props. Students grasped the moral of the story and understood the importance of contentment. Engaging activities and discussions helped them connect the story to real-life situations effectively.



KINDERGARTEN

ENGLISH

This week, letters h and m were introduced. Students practiced writing the letters f, h, and m in their notebooks and workbooks. To reinforce letter recognition and build fine motor skills, they also enjoyed coloring various pictures related to these letters.



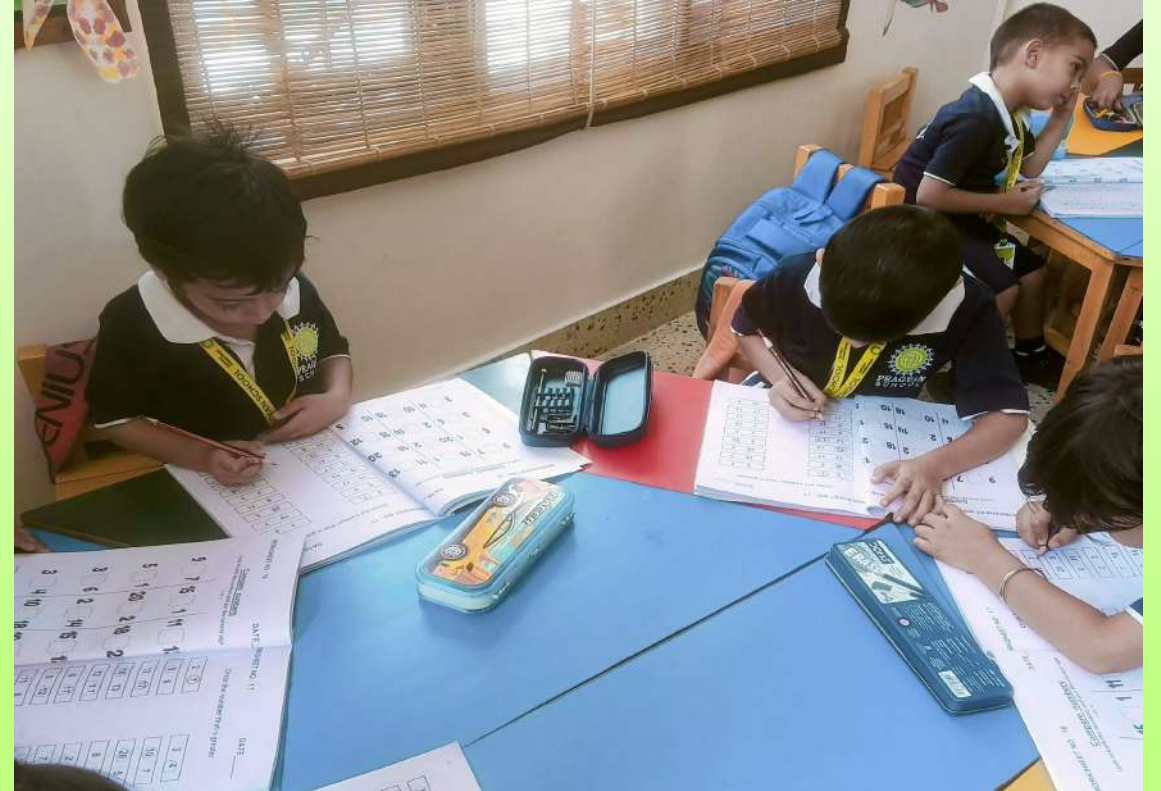
HINDI

Vyanjan ऋ and ॠ were introduced this week. Students completed various related worksheets in their workbooks and notebooks to reinforce recognition and writing. They also enjoyed colouring pages associated with these letters making the learning process engaging and fun. Revision of earlier learned letters was also done with the help of flash cards.



MATH

This week, numbers 50 to 60 were introduced and practiced in class. Key concepts such as greater than, less than, and what comes before were also covered. Students engaged in hands-on practice through workbook exercises as well as notebook activities to strengthen their understanding.



HANDS ON ACTIVITY

This week, hands-on activity was conducted to enhance language learning. In Hindi, children picked vyanjan flashcards and matched them with picture cards beginning with the same sound. The next day, they creatively framed stories using those pictures. In English, students explored CVC (three-letter) words through engaging and interactive activities, making learning fun and effective.



SPLASH POOL / SAND PIT

This week, our little ones enjoyed a refreshing time at the splash pool. Though the weather was a bit weak, it didn't dampen their spirits as they happily splashed water with their friends. Alongside the water fun, the kids also explored their creativity as they learned how to make sandcastles using buckets, adding joy and learning to their playtime.





ENGLISH

The blends 'sm', 'sn', 'st', and 'sp' were revised, and students attempted to read words containing these blends from their book.



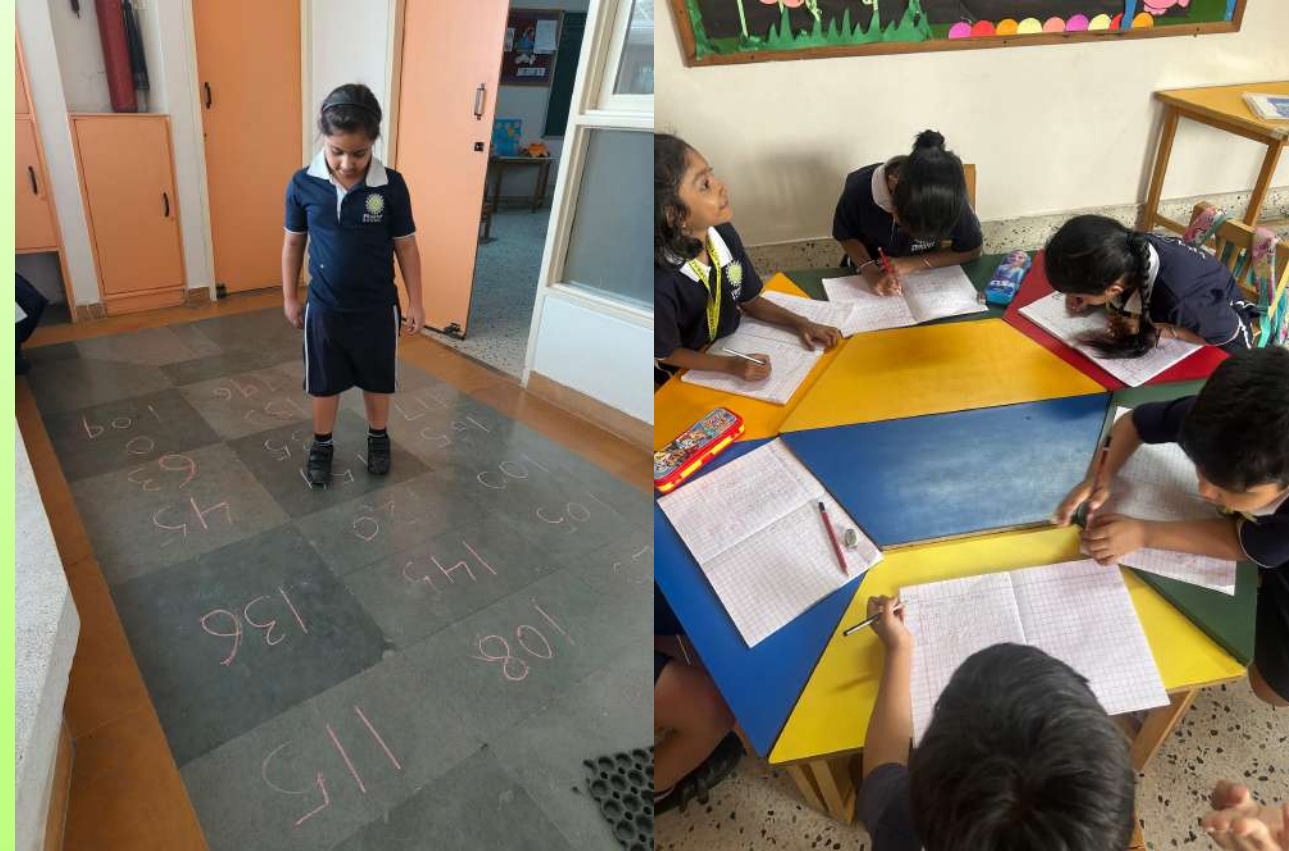
HINDI

"In the Hindi class, char akshar wale shabd and vakya were revised, and worksheets related to this topic were completed. (आ की मात्रा) was introduced in the class, and students attempted to read the akshar by adding the 'aa' ki matra. They also completed a worksheet related to (आ की मात्रा), in which they circled the correct word by looking at the picture.



MATH

In maths, students practiced forward counting from 140 to 160 in their notebooks. They completed worksheets involving identifying numbers that came after, before, and in between within this range. Additionally, students practiced sums on addition in their notebooks and completed a worksheet related to this topic.



GENERAL AWARENESS

In General Awareness, the topic of community helpers was introduced. A general conversation was held in the class related to community helpers, during which students shared their views and knowledge about these helpers. The teacher showed flashcards of various community helpers and discussed them in detail.



EASP

In the sports period, students did marching as part of their drill or formation practice. They then did warm-up exercises to prepare themselves physically for the activities ahead. Following this, they engaged in an activity where they had to place or arrange cones, possibly as part of a drill, obstacle course setup, or a game-related task in their physical education class.



HANDS ON ACTIVITY

As part of hands-on activities, students were given flashcards of numbers to arrange in sequence. A few exercises were conducted for 'before' and 'in between' and based on addition. Through flashcards of community helpers, the roles of the community helpers were explained emphasizing their importance to society.



INTER CLASS ACTIVITY

As part of Inter Class Activity held on 6th August, 2025 students of Nursery, Kindergarten and Upper Kindergarten participated in English Rhyme Time. They recited poems learned in school or of their choice. Prior class practice ensured confident performances by the students, showcasing excellent voice modulation, expression, and creative prop use. The event aimed to enhance language skills and confidence. Winners will be announced soon based on their overall presentation.



JADUI PITARA

As part of Jadui Pitara activity students learnt and enjoyed the concept of 'is', 'am', and 'are' through flashcards. In Hindi, students picked flashcards, added the matra of (आ), and then read it loudly. In General Awareness, students learnt about community helpers through Show & Tell activity and spoke a line or two about that particular community helper. The activity on addition also helped students to reinforce the concept better.





Our students brightened up the week with the **Poem of the Month**, “Opposite Day”—a fun and giggle-worthy piece that got everyone smiling. We explored action words in class, practicing them through joyful notebook writing and lively oral drills.

The highlight was our **Fish Bowl activity**: students picked action words from a bowl and brought them to life with expressive movements and creative sentences—both spoken and written. It was a week full of expression, imagination, and energetic learning!



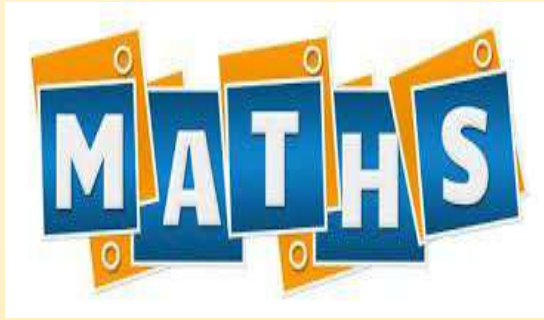


हिन्दी

गत सप्ताह कक्षा में हमारे नन्हें छात्र-छात्राओं ने अगस्त माह के नए शब्दों और कविता का अभ्यास बड़ी उत्साह के साथ किया। उन्होंने विभिन्न फलों के नाम पहचाने, अपना पसंदीदा फल सुंदर चित्र के माध्यम से दर्शाया और उस पर दो वाक्य भी लिखे। एक "खाली स्थान भरो" गतिविधि के ज़रिए बच्चों ने वाक्य संरचना को भी अच्छी तरह समझा।

इसके साथ ही, बच्चों ने रंगों के नाम भी सीखे और एक रंग चुनकर उसे भरने और उसका नाम लिखने वाले मजेदार कार्य में भाग लिया। इन सभी गतिविधियों में बच्चों ने सक्रिय हिस्सा लिया और उन्हें बहुत मज़ा भी आया—साथ ही, उनकी भाषा, सोच और कलात्मक क्षमता में बढ़त भी दिखी।





This past week, our Class 2 learners dove into subtraction using the number line, visually moving backward to grasp how subtraction operates in a concrete, intuitive way. We also practiced skip counting by 2s, which not only makes counting faster but also reinforces recognition of number patterns—an essential building block for grasping multiplication concepts. To reinforce these skills, the children reviewed and recited the table of 2, strengthening their recall and mental arithmetic abilities.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Our little learners enjoyed a colorful dive into the new chapter, "Food." Through an interactive reading, they understood why what we eat matters—and picked up some new Words of the Month along the way.

During “Let’s Talk” time, they eagerly discussed healthy eating habits, showing growing awareness about making mindful food choices. The week’s highlight was a fun activity where children sorted food items into healthy and unhealthy categories using bright cutouts and real-life examples. Then, through a Think–Pair–Share, they reflected with friends on how food affects our health—boosting both their thinking and teamwork skills.

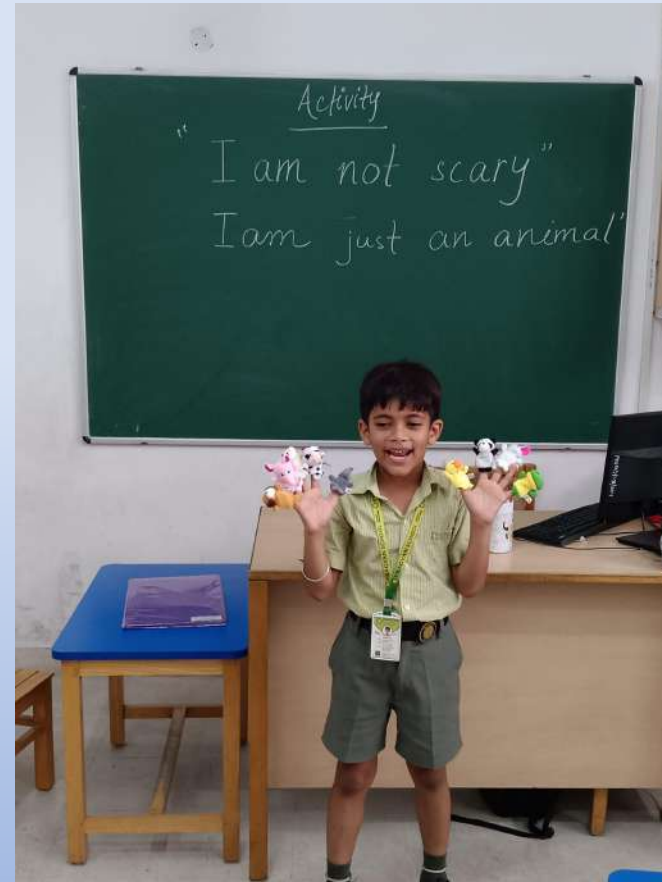

Our students eagerly focused on learning new vocabulary for August and read Chapter 3 with genuine understanding. They answered questions from the lesson, enjoyed a fun poem, and participated in a thinking activity that encouraged creative thinking.

A vibrant class discussion followed, where children shared their ideas with enthusiasm. They also practiced identifying and using **nouns**—completing exercises in both their notebooks and workbooks. Altogether, the week strengthened their reading skills, expanded their vocabulary, and nurtured their creative thinking.





This week, our Class 2 students dove into the world of multiplication! We began with an introduction to multiplication, explored key facts, and brought the concept to life using the number line—visualizing multiplication as repeated jumps along a line. This hands-on method helps students picture how amounts add up, reinforcing the idea of multiplication as repeated addition.

To strengthen their learning, students practiced multiplication tables from 5 to 8 and also revisited place value concepts, ensuring a solid foundation for further math exploration.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Our students revisited the ideas of celebrations, special days, and various types of festivals celebrated across India. The highlight was a creative **poster-making activity**, where students designed invitations for their chosen festivals, symbolically inviting others to join in the celebrations.



INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC



This week, our students joyfully discovered the harmonium and keyboard in their instrumental music class. With hands-on demonstrations, they explored basic notes and sounds while learning how to play these melodious instruments.

The session was lively and engaging, sparking excitement and curiosity among our young musicians. Such interactive music experiences are more than just fun—they help nurture rhythm, boost concentration, and build fine motor skills.

COMPUTER CLASS 1



Our curious Class 1 learners recently dove into the classic Tic-Tac-Toe game—digitally—using the educational software GCompris. This user-friendly program offers fun, age-appropriate activities, including Tic-Tac-Toe, designed to promote logical thinking, decision-making, and basic computer skills.

Working in pairs, the children took turns marking their Xs and Os on the screen. It was not only enjoyable but also a great way to gently introduce them to digital interaction with confidence.

COMPUTER CLASS 2



Our Class 2 students had a great time working with **Tux Typing**, a fun, child-friendly typing tutor. With engaging, game-like activities—like helping Tux the penguin catch fish or zap comets—they practiced identifying key positions and typing with accuracy and speed.

Through guided lessons, they continued practicing typing and became more familiar with the keyboard layout. This interactive experience not only improved their typing skills but also supported their writing development in a playful and effective way.

CLASS ASSEMBLY CLASS 1B

Children of Class 1B conducted their class assembly on the theme "Connecting the World." They began with inspiring thoughts and a thoughtful speech before moving on to share fascinating facts about global connections. The students then performed a lovely English poem followed by a heartfelt Hindi poem. The assembly ended on a high note with an uplifting song that left everyone feeling inspired.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

This week, our students enthusiastically learned a new physical activity step by step: the Forehead Toss Shadow technique. With focused practice, they improved their posture and coordination bit by bit. This activity helped enhance their balance, concentration, and motor skills. The children stayed fully engaged throughout and genuinely enjoyed exploring this fun new method!



ART AND CRAFT

As part of their preparation for the upcoming inter class craft activity, our Grade 1 students practiced making paper cup houses, while Grade 2 explored their creativity by crafting paper cup hats. These hands-on sessions not only fueled their imagination but also helped fine-tune their fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and creative thinking.



LIBRARY

The library isn't just a place for books—it's a heaven where young minds find peace, focus, and joy. Our Class 2 students step into the library to read, they become completely absorbed in the stories—the characters, the journey, the plot—and for that moment, everything else pauses. They enter a world so engaging that their minds forget stress and simply enjoy the story.



MATIFIC

Our students from Classes 1 and 2 had a wonderful time exploring mathematics through engaging play-based activities. They also used Matific, an exciting digital platform, to reinforce their learning in a fun and effective way.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

In EVS, students of Class 3 have been introduced to the chapter "Birds." They actively participated in discussions and wrote new words and question-answers in their notebooks. To enhance understanding, real feathers were shown in class. Students also learned about the functions of different parts of a bird and explored the various types of feathers birds have. The activity encouraged observation, curiosity, and hands-on learning.





Students of class 3 wrote word problems based on subtraction and on combined addition and subtraction in their notebooks and the multiplication facts. They practiced subtraction in their workbook to reinforce their understanding. Additionally, they worked on Maths Mindspark to enhance their accuracy and speed.





Students of Grade 4 were introduced to the new words and poem of the month, 'Our Flag Flies High', this week. They wrote questions and answers, and read the lines and answer the questions of the lesson 'Guno and Koyo'. Additionally, they completed exercises on grammatical concepts such as articles, punctuation, and subject and predicate in the Engaging English workbook.

Students of Grade 4 reinforced their understanding of multiplication by practicing a variety of questions like multiplication of 2- digit and 3- digit numbers in the workbook and the joy of maths. They also learned the application of multiplication properties by solving questions of different forms.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Grade 4 students completed the chapter Animals, where they explored the fascinating world of animal classification, adaptations and habitats. They learned about the different groups of Vertebrates along with their unique characteristics. The concept of how animals adapt to survive in different environments was discussed through interactive sessions and engaging educational videos. Students showed great enthusiasm as they compared various animals and understood their roles in the food chain also.





This week, the children explored **Adjectives** and their types. As part of the activity, they described the different **puppets** from their Literature lesson using suitable adjectives, which helped them apply grammar concepts creatively. They also participated in an interactive **Mind Spark session** to reinforce their learning. In Literature, we continued with "**The Birth of the Seasons**", and the **back exercises** were completed and discussed in class. It was a week filled with active participation and enjoyable learning.

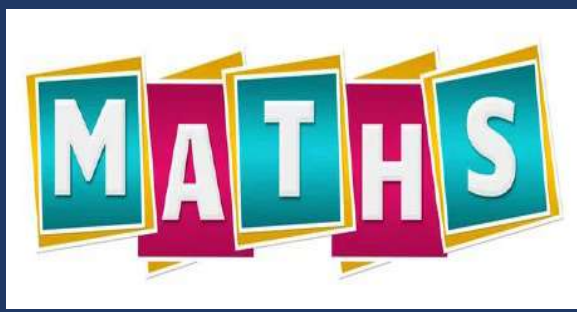




हिन्दी

The students in Class 5 explored the concept of Lowest Common Multiples (LCM) through engaging activities and hands-on practice. They not only learned how to find the LCM of given numbers but also grasped different methods to calculate it, such as prime factorization and short division method.

To reinforce their learning, the class participated in a maths game “Factor Chain” where they identified factors and multiples using flashcards and tried to form a chain. This interactive game encouraged teamwork, critical thinking, and quick problem-solving, making the abstract concepts of factors and multiples more tangible and fun.

Additionally, the students practiced solving problems related to HCF (Highest Common Factor) and LCM in both their notebooks and workbooks.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Grade 5 students recently completed the chapter on the *Nervous System*, where they explored the structure and function of the human nervous system. They learned about the different parts of the brain, the spinal cord, and the network of nerves that control various activities in our body. Engaging educational videos were shown to enhance their understanding, which the students thoroughly enjoyed. The interactive learning experience made the topic both informative and fun!



CLASS ASSEMBLY 4D

Class 4D conducted a two-days' morning assembly on the theme "The Importance of Stories." The assembly was a vibrant celebration of storytelling. Over the course of the two days, students explored the magical world of stories through various engaging character enactment performances and presentations.
