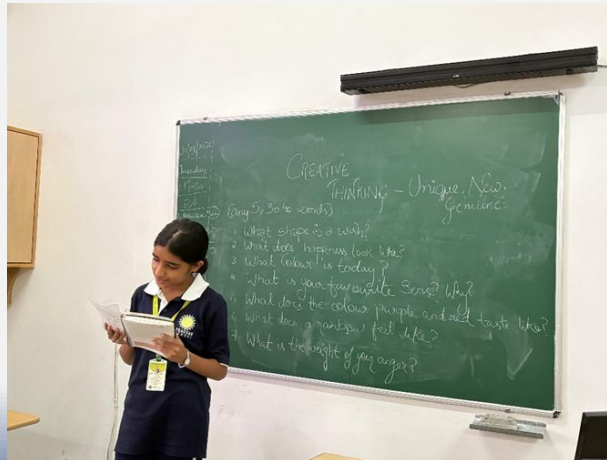


LIFE SKILL SESSIONS

To help adolescents build essential skills for navigating real-life challenges, life skills sessions were conducted for the students. As part of this initiative, classes VI and VII participated in Creative Thinking activities designed to encourage imagination and originality.

Grade VI students were given a list of 12 words, from which they had to creatively use at least 8 to compose a story with a moral. The activity allowed them to explore different genres and showcase their storytelling abilities.

Grade VII students, on the other hand, were presented with abstract questions that had no fixed right or wrong answers. These questions were intended to expand their perspective and encourage them to think in diverse, open-ended ways.



TEACHERS' WORKSHOP

Mass Media Workshop organized by CBSE at Bennett University was attended by Ms Vinita Arora, on 26.09.2025, which proved to be a valuable and rewarding learning experience. The sessions covered the changing trends in media, digital journalism, and the growing influence of new platforms in communication. ECOLOGY CLUB VI-VIII: GREEN WARRIORS

On Friday, 3rd October 2025, the young members of the Ecology Club enthusiastically participated in an engaging session titled "Talk on National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries", organized as part of the World Wildlife Week celebrations (2nd to 8th October). During the event, the children shared thoughtful ideas on how everyday actions can contribute to the protection and preservation of wildlife. They highlighted the importance of individual responsibility and how collective efforts can make a big difference in conserving nature. The session also shed light on various initiatives taken by the Government of India to protect endangered species and their habitats. The students spoke about key conservation programs such as Project Tiger and Project Rhino, discussing how these efforts have played a vital role in wildlife protection. It was a meaningful and educational experience, fostering awareness and responsibility among students towards the rich biodiversity of our country.

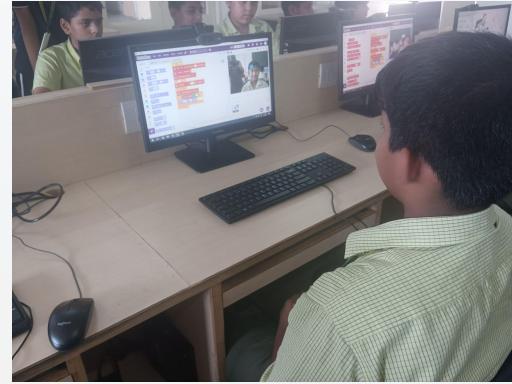
SCIENCE CLUB VI-VIII: THE INNOVATORS

In the science club, the students of class VI discussed the lemon battery experiment, exploring how lemons generate electricity through electrochemical reactions. The acidic nature of lemons facilitates the flow of electric current when copper and zinc electrodes are inserted, illustrating key scientific principles and alternative energy concepts. Class VII students designed and developed models such as the Steady Hand Game, based on the principle of electric circuits and conductivity, which helped them explore the concept of open and closed circuits. The Jackpot Wheel demonstrated probability and rotational motion, allowing students to link science with mathematics in a playful way. Another innovative model, the Stadium with Automatic Covers, was created using sensors and simple machines, helping students understand automation, motion, and control systems. The Class VIII Science Club successfully conducted an engaging activity focused on designing games rooted in scientific principles. Students enthusiastically participated, demonstrating their understanding through varied creative outputs; some prepared detailed game layouts on A4 sheets, while others went further by constructing functional models and providing enthusiastic explanations of the core scientific reasoning driving their designs.



COMPUTER CLUB: TECHSPARK

The students of the Computer Club gained practical knowledge in face detection by exploring machine learning methods. As part of their learning experience, they were introduced to the fundamental concepts of machine learning and how it can be applied to detect human faces in images. This included working with tools and pre-trained models to recognize and locate facial features. Through hands-on projects and coding exercises, the students developed a deeper understanding of how computers can be trained to identify faces automatically.



READERS CLUB VI-VIII: THE PAGE TURNERS

On 3.10.25, the Readers Club students, divided into teams, began their activities with clear objectives. They started by writing detailed book reviews to enhance their understanding of fantasy literature. At the same time, they created character sketches of fantasy fiction characters, fostering creativity and connection with the stories. Additionally, the teams designed themed borders to complement their work visually. These activities aimed to develop critical thinking, artistic skills, and teamwork. By the end of the session, the students had made significant progress in preparing creative and insightful content, demonstrating both enthusiasm and commitment to their tasks.

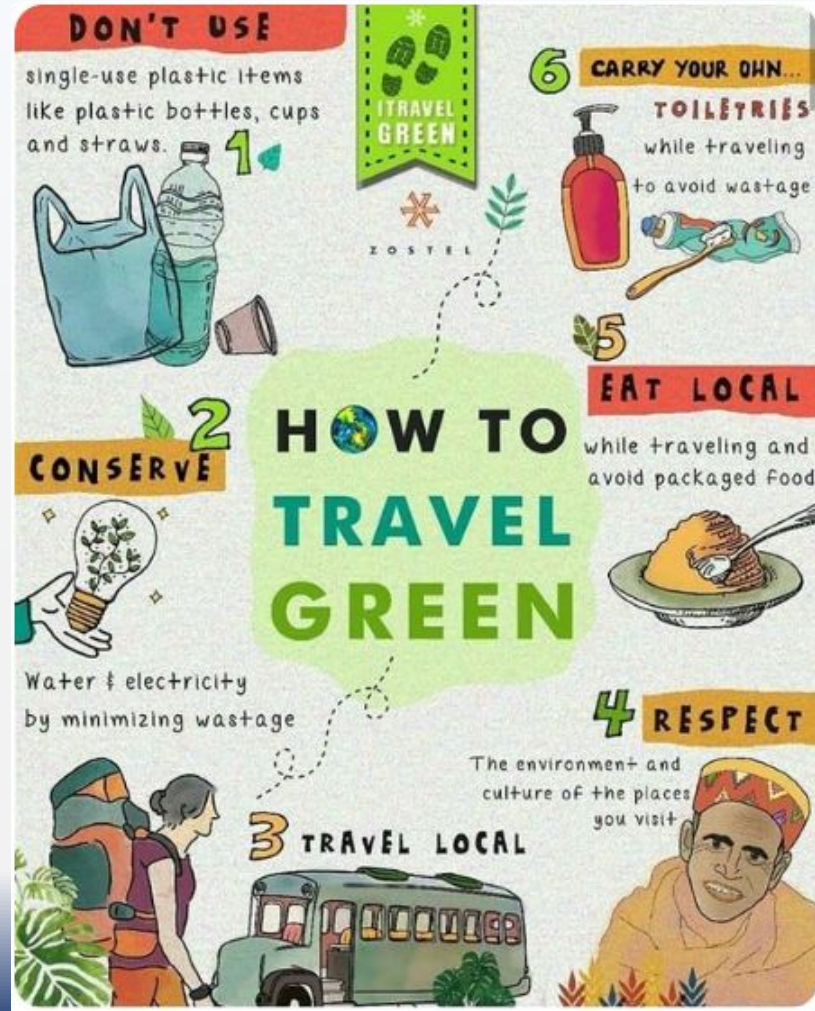


INTERACT CLUB VI-VII: HELPING HANDS
