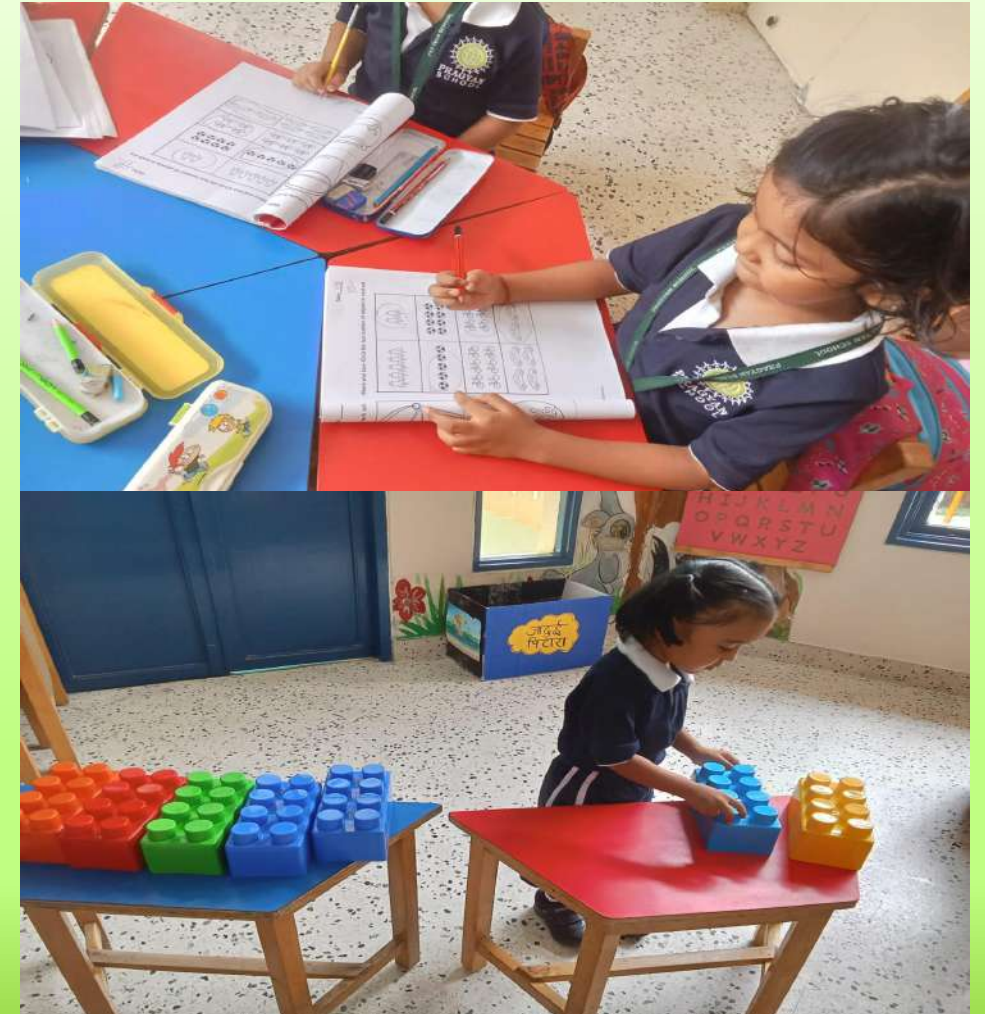
ENGLISH

Letter V was introduced to the children with the help of flashcards and different objects. They also did Jolly phonics song of letter V which they enjoyed. Students did worksheets related to the letter in their workbook and did sandpaper tracing as well.



MATHS

This week number 7 was introduced to the students using blocks and they also did worksheets related to the number. Children also did pre-number concepts more or less in their workbook. Children also did counting using blocks.



HINDI

Vyanjan 'ज' was introduced to the students with the help of pictures. They also enjoyed colouring 'ज' related objects in their Hindi letter book.



CRAFT

Students created colourful artworks using inflated balloon techniques, developing fine motor skills, colour recognition, and creativity.



CLAY MODELING

Students were engaged in clay modeling, creating desired objects of their choice, developing fine motor skills & creativity. Free-hand activities fostered imagination, self-expression & hand-eye coordination, showcasing growth.



KINDERGARTEN



ENGLISH

Letter h was introduced to the students through its phonic sound. Flashcards were used to help them recognize and associate the sound with various objects. The students were enthusiastic and eagerly shared examples of objects that start with the letter h. They successfully completed a worksheet related to the letter, demonstrating their understanding and engagement.

HINDI

Students were introduced to the vyanjan ऋ. To make learning more engaging, students were encouraged to colour pictures beginning with vyanjan ऋ. This helped them associate visual creativity with language learning. The combination of writing and colouring made the learning process interactive and enjoyable, keeping students engaged.



CRAFT (KG)

This week the students of kindergarten were engaged in a vibrant craft activity where the children created tricolor chakras and butterflies. Using materials like coloured paper, glue, glitters and paints, the little ones crafted beautiful representations of the Ashoka Chakra. This craft activity not only allowed the children to express their creativity but also instilled a sense of patriotism as they learned about the significance of India's independence in a fun and interactive way.



SKILL BASED LEARNING (KG)

As part of skill based learning, kindergarten practiced fine motor skills through activities like buttoning and unbuttoning, zipping and unzipping, fastening and unfastening hooks, putting of tich buttons, and tying knots with ribbons. These exercises help improve hand-eye coordination, finger strength, and dexterity, essential for tasks like writing and dressing independently. It promotes cognitive development, patience, focus, encouraging independence and confidence in performing everyday tasks.





GENERAL AWARENESS

During this week students did community helper worksheets that included matching, tick the correct one. They also revised and wrote difficult words like doctor, tailor, fireman, teacher, police etc.



MATHS

This week students were introduced to numbers from 140 - 160. They did forward counting, backward counting, before, after and between related to numbers from 100 - 160 in their work books. They also practiced the concept of greater and smaller numbers on black board.

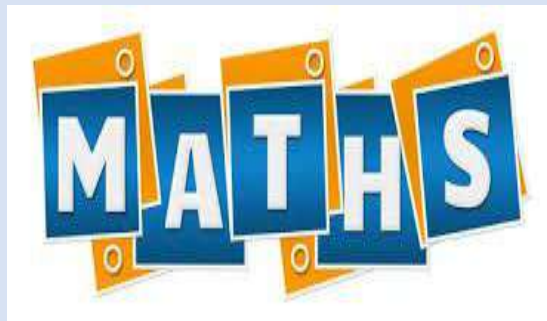




ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE
