NURSERY



ENGLISH

Nursery students revised letter L and explored letter T, learning formation and phonics sound. They enjoyed coloring worksheets, reinforcing new learning in a fun and engaging way.

MATHS

This week, students revised number 1 and grasped 'big and small' concepts through engaging worksheets, enhancing math skills and fine motor development.



HINDI

This week ,students revised the letter 'क' and were introduced to the letter 'ख' through engaging worksheets and colourful activities, developing their Hindi alphabet recognition skills.



HANDS ON ACTIVITY

Nursery students enjoyed a water pouring activity, developing fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination. They poured water into glasses, learning through hands-on experience and having fun with water play.



JADUI PITARA

Nursery students discovered letter T (Literacy) and number 1 (Numeracy) through 'Jadui Pitara', a fun and interactive activity. This engaging experience fostered curiosity and helped them learn with excitement and enthusiasm.



ORATORY SKILLS

This week, nursery students developed oratory skills by learning to greet and introduce themselves. Confidently, they practiced and shared their names, fostering self-expression and communication skills in a supportive environment.



KINDERGARTEN

ENGLISH

Students were introduced to the letter d through phonic sounds and flashcards. They also completed a worksheet related to the alphabet and enjoyed the colouring of objects that start with the letter d, such as doll, drum, and dog.



HINDI

The students were introduced to the swar 'ई', they were able to write it in their workbooks and colour the related objects to enhance their recognition skills.



GENERAL AWARENESS

This week, students learned about nuclear and joint families through stories and discussions. They enjoyed colouring worksheets to identify family members and understand their roles. The activity made learning about family bonds fun and meaningful.



DANCE

This week, our vibrant dance classes brought joy and energy to the students as they moved to the rhythm of lively music. Guided by the teacher, the students explored new steps, expressed themselves freely, and built confidence through movement.



ESAP

This week, students enjoyed their regular warm-up exercises, building strength and coordination. The highlight was the exciting fun races, where kids showcased their agility and had lots of fun while staying active.



JADUI PITARA

The students had a fun and engaging class with Jadui Pitara. They were very excited to explore what was inside the mystery box. Each student picked a flashcard of their choice. The activity was based on Hindi Swar (vowels). After selecting their flashcards, the students enthusiastically identified the objects and shared sentences related to them. It was a joyful and educational session that helped reinforce their understanding of Hindi vowels in a playful way.



SCIENCE DEMONSTRATION

The students were introduced to the concept of "heavy and light" through a fun and engaging experiment. They learned that heavy objects sink in water, while light objects float. They practically conducted this by placing various items such as a flower, marbles, eraser, pencil, crayon, and a ball, into a bowl full of water. They observed that the lighter objects floated, while the heavier ones sank, helping them understand the difference between heavy and light in a hands-on way.



HANDS ON ACTIVITY (KG)

Students were introduced to the concept of the 'before number.' They participated in an activity where they picked a flashcard from their own choice and identified the number that came before the one they selected. They also practiced backward counting by jumping on numbers written on the floor.



ORATORY SKILLS

During the oratory skill period, the students were engaged in a captivating storytelling session, where they attentively listened to a narrative that sparked their imagination and curiosity. As they absorbed the story, they developed their listening skills, comprehension, and creativity, laying the foundation for effective communication and public speaking and they also tried to narrate the story using props.



SPLASH POOL AND SAND PIT

This week, our little learners had a splashing good time as they enjoyed the much-awaited Splash Pool activity. Dressed in colorful swimwear and filled with excitement, the children played with water. It was more than just a playtime—it was a celebration of summer.





ENGLISH

Students practiced writing lowercase letters from a to z in their notebooks, reinforcing their alphabet recognition and handwriting skills. Additionally, they read CVC (Consonant-Vowel-Consonant) words consisting of three letters, developing their phonetic awareness, decoding skills, and reading fluency. This foundational exercise strengthened their literacy skills, building a strong base for future reading and writing abilities.



HINDI

Students took a significant step forward in their reading journey, confidently deciphering and reading दो अक्षर वाले शब्द (two-letter words). This milestone marked a notable achievement in their linguistic development, enhancing their phonetic awareness, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. As they progressed, they built a strong foundation in Hindi, paving the way for further exploration and appreciation of the language.



GENERAL AWARENESS

Students were made aware that families come in different sizes, broadly categorized as joint family and nuclear family. They were also shown flashcards and were asked to speak a line on their family members.



DANCE

The dance class was a vibrant celebration of movement and rhythm, where students let loose and expressed themselves through energetic choreography. As they twirled, leaped, and swayed to the music, they not only honed their technical dance skills but also developed their creativity, self-expression and confidence.



EASP

As part of EASP, children were engaged in a dynamic and energetic environment, fostering physical fitness, teamwork, and healthy competition. Through a variety of exercises and games, they developed essential skills such as coordination, strategy and communication.



YOGA

Students embarked on a journey of physical, mental, and emotional well-being, exploring various poses, breathing techniques, and meditation practices during yoga classes. Through this holistic approach, they developed flexibility, balance, and strength, while also cultivating focus, calmness, and self-awareness.



CLAY MODELLING ACTIVITY

The students showcased their creativity through clay modelling, crafting adorable ice cream models. This engaging project not only allowed them to express their imagination but also helped improve their fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and creativity. By shaping and molding clay, students developed their problem-solving abilities, attention to detail, and self-expression, making it a fun and enriching learning experience.



SKILL BASED ACTIVITY

In a practical skill-based activity, students acquired the essential skills of folding their aprons, t-shirts, sorting books and stacking them neatly. Through skill based learning, they developed their fine motor skills, organizational abilities, and attention to detail. This activity promoted self-reliance, responsibility, and a sense of orderliness, teaching children valuable life skills that foster independence and confidence.



ORATORY SKILLS

In the oratory skill class, children developed the art of effective communication, learning to express their thoughts, ideas, and opinions with clarity, confidence, and conviction. Through engaging activities, discussions, and presentations, they honed their public speaking skills, cultivated critical thinking, and refined their tone, pitch, and body language.



READING SKILLS

In the reading skill class, children honed their literacy abilities, learning to read with fluency, accuracy, and expression. Through guided practice and engaging texts, they developed their phonemic awareness, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. As they progressed, they gained confidence in their reading abilities, cultivating a lifelong love for reading and learning that would serve them well in all aspects of their academic and personal lives.



MUSIC

This week in music class, students began each session with the serene chanting of the Gayatri Mantra, creating a peaceful and focused atmosphere. The classes continued with a rhythmic warm-up (seven sargam), helping children improve their vocal coordination and pitch sense. By participating in music, the children cultivated a sense of rhythm and musical awareness, enriching their overall artistic experience.



HANDS ON ACTIVITY (UKG)

As part of hands-on activity, students were given akshars (letters) and tasked with creatively forming two-letter words(Hindi). This engaging exercise enhanced their linguistic skills, vocabulary, and problem-solving abilities. By combining letters to form meaningful words, students developed their phonetic awareness, spelling, and critical thinking, laying a strong foundation for language development and literacy.





Our little learners have been on an exciting journey this week! They explored the "st" sound and wrote five wonderful words in their notebooks, bringing the letters to life through reading. We also played with the concept of "One" and "Many," making learning feel like a fun game!

In a burst of creativity, the children crafted collages of school items—what a colorful display of imagination! They also shared their memories of "My First Day at School" in the Speak Spark session, speaking with confidence and joy. Alongside, we introduced our Poem of the Month and Words of the Month, enriching their vocabulary with every verse.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Our Class 1 explorers revisited the chapters "My Body" and "My Family", connecting ideas through engaging discussions. They embarked on a wonderful discovery of their Neighbourhood, reading the lesson with enthusiasm and sharing what they see around them every day.

Children recorded their learning beautifully through notebook work and strengthened their concepts with focused workbook practice. These activities helped deepen their understanding in a fun and meaningful way.





Children enjoyed doing counting from 301 - 400 in their notebooks and workbook. Before and after between, forward counting and backward counting were also done for the same numbers.

Students of class 2 revised the concept of ‘Sentences’ with some exercises in their notebooks and workbooks. They were also introduced to the concept of Proper nouns and rhyming words in the class and did the related exercises in the notebooks.

Class 2 students made great progress in math, mastering tables of 4, 5, and 6, understanding numbers before, after, and in between (1-999), comparing numbers using lesser than, greater than, and equal to (1-999), arranging numbers in ascending and descending order, and reinforcing addition facts.



INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC (1&2)



Learning to play musical instruments supports children's cognitive, emotional, and social development, while also boosting their self-esteem.

This week, students learned basic alankars like Sa Re Ga, Re Ga Ma, and Ga Ma Pa on the keyboard. They were also taught the importance of rhythm and given a chance to play individually.

MATIFIC (1&2)



“Maths is fun”, students of class 1 & 2 practiced mathematical concepts through the technological platform Matific within the school. They were allotted a few activities during their Maths class based on whole numbers and addition.

DANCE (CLASS 2)

Students of class 2 learnt new dance steps through various characters in the story. They also practiced simple foot steps on counts and drum beats.



LIBRARY (1 & 2)

Reading is a good habit that one needs to develop. Students of class 2 come to the library to read books of their choice. As they read loudly they keep on hearing new words being used in different contexts. Through reading they develop strong vocabulary.



CLASS ASSEMBLY (2E)

Class 2E conducted assembly on 23rd and 28th April 2025 on the theme "Happiness." Students shared the thought of the day related to happiness and positive living. They spoke about importance of happiness in life. Students discussed simple ways to remain happy every day and highlighted the benefits of staying happy, like better health and stronger friendships. Some amazing facts about happiness were also shared by the students. The assembly was full of energy, smiles, and valuable lessons. Everyone enjoyed the event and learned how important it is to spread happiness.



INTER CLASS WEEKLY ACTIVITY(1&2)

Thumb painting is a wonderful form of sensory play that enhances artistic skills. Finger painting also supports fine motor development by strengthening the muscles in the fingers and hands. It provides children with a creative outlet to express their emotions without using words.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Important words with meanings and question-answers were thoroughly discussed and written in their notebooks. Students of grade 4 were introduced to the lesson, 'The Noble Dog' this week. In grammar, they learned about singular and plural nouns, completing exercises in their notebooks and workbooks. The highlight of the week was the 'Mountain Trip' activity, where students creatively listed and illustrated essential items to pack for a mountain trip, explaining the purpose of each.





ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The students of Grade 4 successfully completed the chapter “Plants.” Through engaging class discussions and visual aids, they learned about different types of plants, including terrestrial and aquatic varieties. They explored how plants adapt to their environments, from those that grow on land and in water to insectivorous plants that trap insects for nutrients. 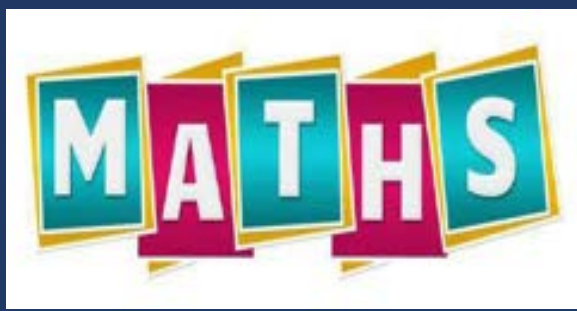




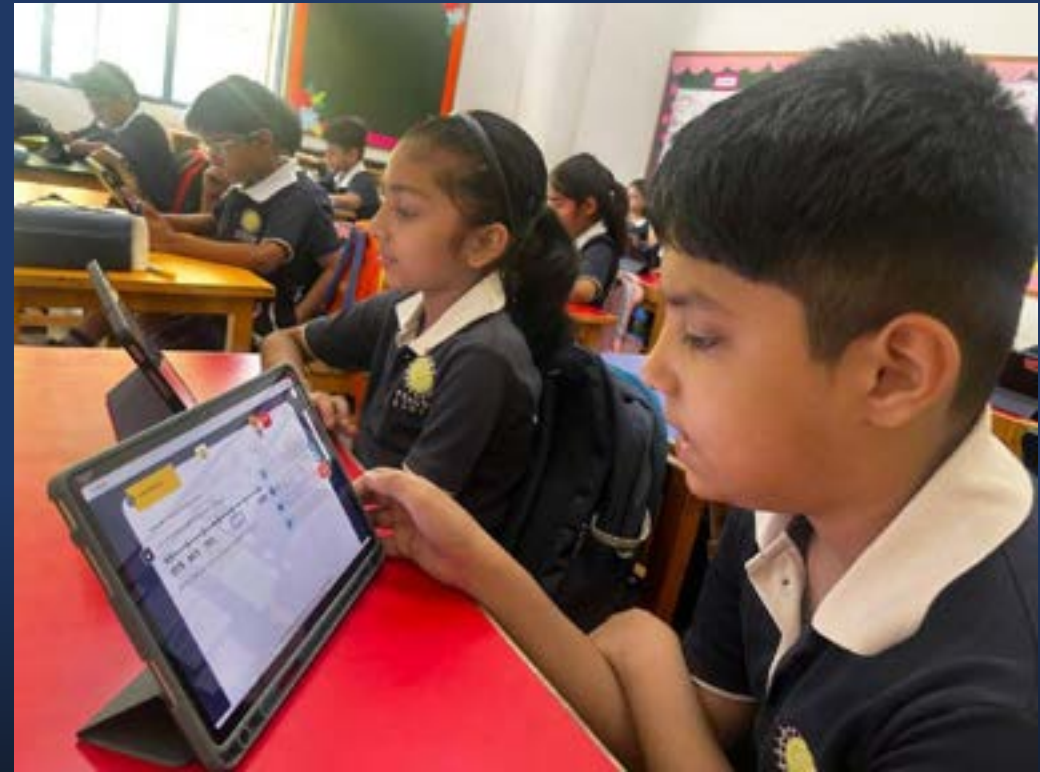
हिन्दी
