The **INTERIOR** of the triangle below is coloured in orange.





- Act as a Good Samaritan and help road accident victims

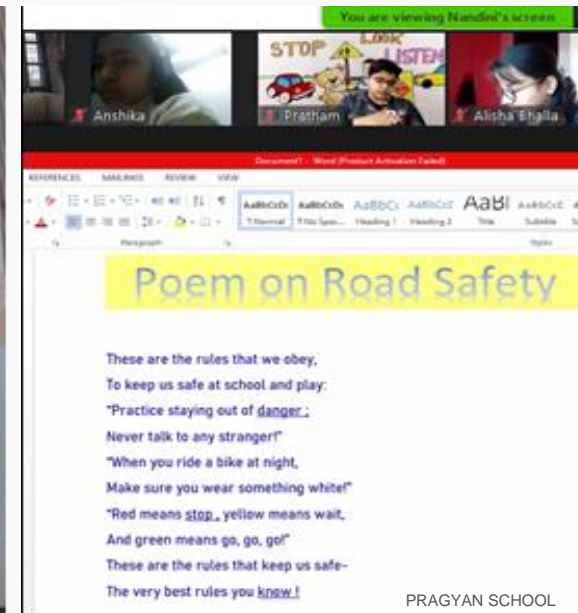
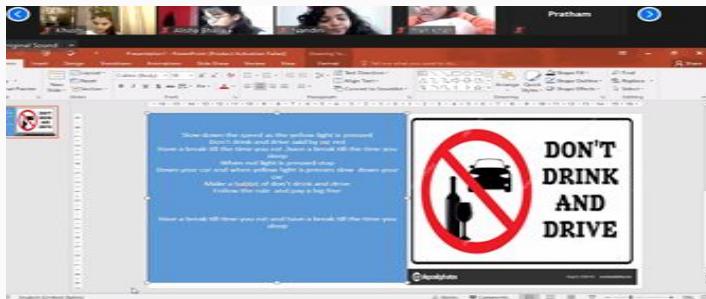

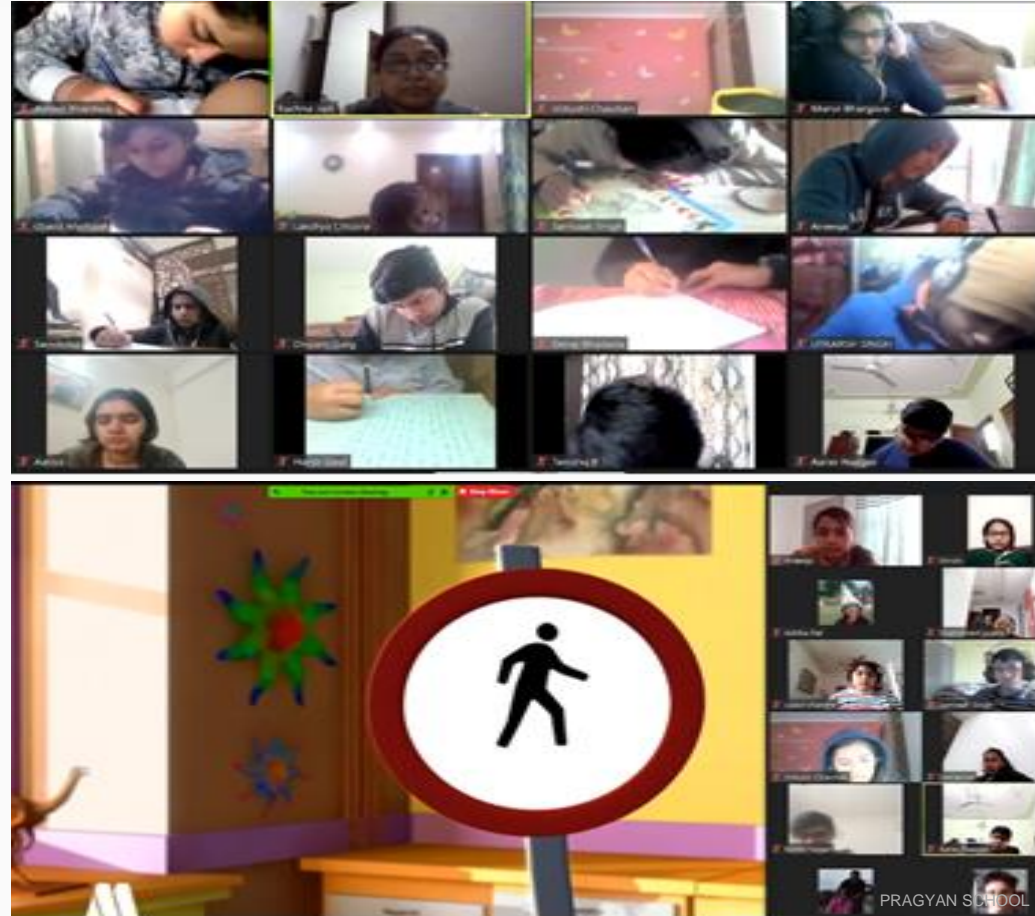
CLASS TEACHER PERIOD-VII

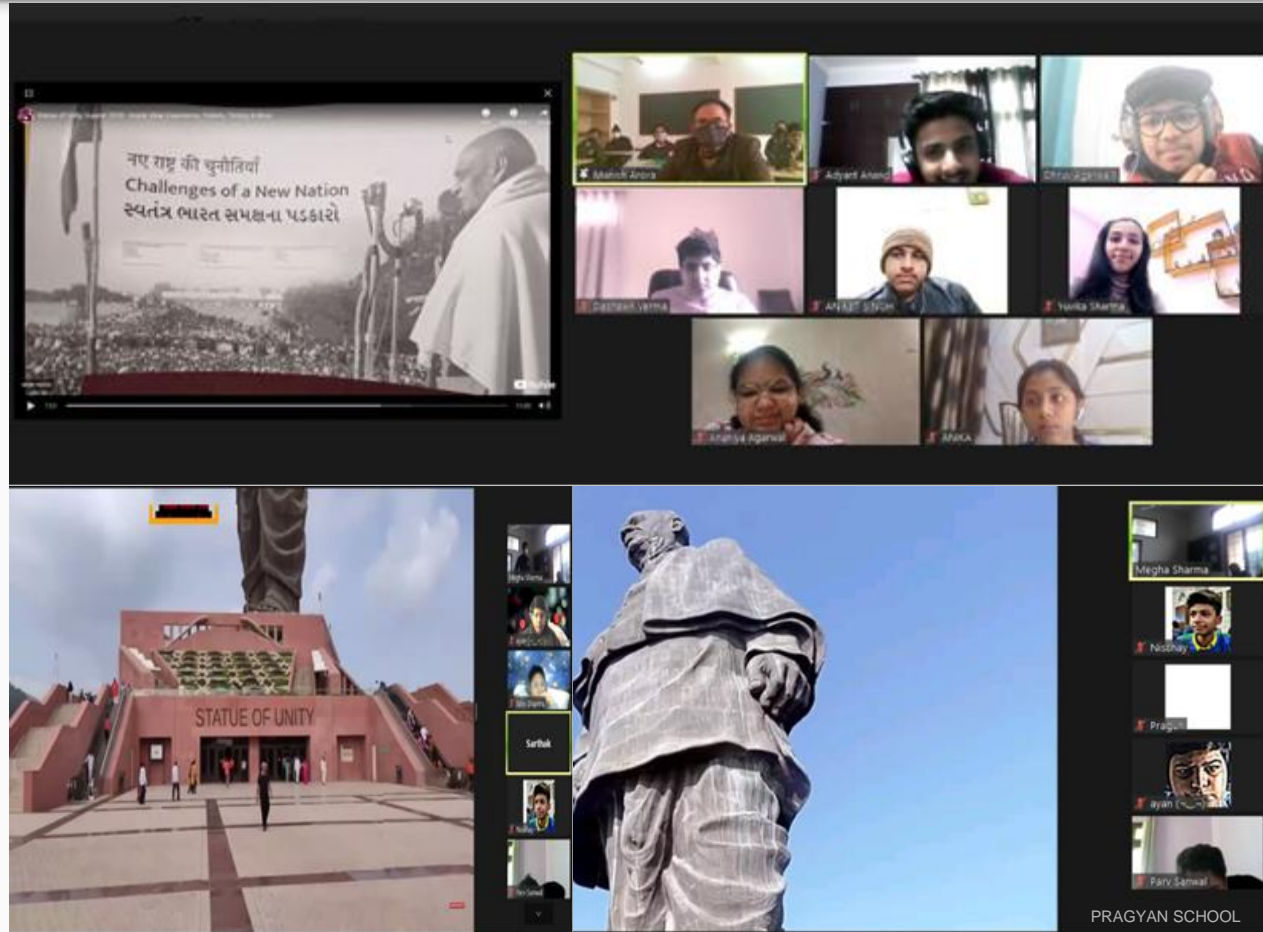
CLASS TEACHER PERIOD-VIII


WEBINAR :

Ms. Seema Sharma, Ms. Ria Nanda, and Ms. Anju Singh attended training webinar on 'concept mapping' on 30 Jan 2021, organized by Propel Thy learning. The resource person Mr. Vishnu Kant explained the process of relating different concepts together with help of concept map to make the concepts easier for the learner. 'Cmap' software was also introduced to the participants. It empowers users to construct, navigate, share and criticize knowledge models represented as concept maps.

A **concept map** is divided into nodes and links. Nodes (often circles) represent various concepts; and links (lines) represent the relationships (propositions) between concepts. Words are used to label the links in order to more explicitly depict relationships.
