The organisation has taken up the campaign on waste management under the collaboration of HCL Foundation. The major aim of the workshop was to sensitize the students on the “Waste Management”. The workshop began with brainstorming session wherein students were involved in the survey exercise. The workshop involved the students in discussion where their inputs on waste segregation were taken up. The workshop brought forward the ideas regarding the right ways to manage waste.

Students were encouraged to incorporate the practice of proper waste management under the three categories that are dry waste (Blue), wet waste (Green) and domestic hazardous waste (Red). The students were given an array of information regarding the “Three R Policy”. The workshop brought forward the impacts of waste on the animals and gave evaluative measures that can help in reducing the impacts on the animals. The workshop was concluded by encouraging the students to make creative products out of dry waste and they will be scored on the basis of their creation.
